INCLEMENT WEATHER-SCHOOL CLOSURE

In the event of severe or inclement weather, the decision to close schools <u>PRIOR</u> to the start of the school day is made **before 7am** and is announced on the following radio stations: CKTB 610, CHTZ 97.7, CHRE 105.7, CKEY (RIVER)105.1, SPIRIT 91.7, CHSC 1212, SKOC 1150, K-LITE 1-2.9, CHML 900, Y95.3, WAVE 94.7 and CHCH TV.

The students at Carleton Public School ride "DanNel Busses (905-934-1124) or First Student" (905-688-9600).

In the event of an Emergency School Closure, students will be dismissed and/or sent home via their buses unless they can be picked up **immediately** by parents/guardians. When selecting the 'stay at school' option on our forms for the rare occasion of early school closure, it is understood that this means pick up will occur immediately. This form does NOT indicate that extended child-care or supervision is available.

PLEASE NOTE: The school can not phone all homes to inform them of an early closure before students are dismissed as this is unrealistic due to the number of calls it would take to connect with each family in a limited amount of time. Early school closure will be communicated via the above listed radio stations and TV channel, so if the weather is questionable and the roads difficult, please stay tuned to the radio!

Please consider making arrangements with a neighbour who can help to supervise your children in the event of an early school closure if you work out of town! Having a hidden key for older students is also a smart precautionary measure to ensure that students can get into the house if you haven't arrived yet when they arrive home!

Video surveillance will consist of one camera installed at our front entrance. While the surveillance video camera is just one of the tools we will use to foster a safe and secure learning environment under the Safe Schools Act, it will be in compliance with the Municipal Freedom of Information and Protection of Privacy Act.


