We expect ALL who visit to follow these general rules:

- Adult supervision is required.
- Please dress modestly. No bikinis or Speedo's. Wear modest swim suits or cover them if necessary
- No smoking, alcoholic drinks, or illegal drugs
- Be very careful with any Fire. There is a lot of dry grass on the property.
- No fighting, profanity, vulgar, or abusive language
- · No Pets, No Pets, No Pets.
- Please don't bring glass containers
- Clean up after yourself and haul out your garbage
- If you break something, (or it is broken) please let me know
- Be respectful of our property and pay for any item you break or damage
- Follow all 'Safety and Maintenance' Rules on page 2
- Adult Supervisors, Remember the formula: "youth + water park = no common sense"
- Use of pond and all equipment is AT YOUR OWN RISK

OUR RIGHTS:

- We reserve the right to ask anyone to leave for any reason.
- We will ask you to pay for any items that are broken or damaged during your stay.
- We reserve the right to allow our family, friends, or guests to use our facilities at any time.

POND SAFETY & MAINTENANCE RULES

Overall rule and safety guidelines:

- Basically, if you wouldn't be allowed to do it in a commercial water park, don't disrespect us by trying to do it here
- Adult Supervisors are in charge of your group and must maintain control. note: a referee's whistle is a good tool

General:

- Adult supervision is a must
- Please be considerate of others (whether from your group or another group)
- No mud fights
- Don't throw rocks or other things into the pond
- Please have <u>responsible</u> & <u>assigned</u> life guards each with a loud whistle
- Non-swimmers please bring life vests
- If you use our life vests please hang wet ones outside of storage shed to dry

Big Water Slide:

- If the water is not turned on in the slide, it is closed. Do not attempt to turn on the water or start the slide.
- Do not climb on or over the slide or on the supports.
- Be gentle when operating and don't sit on the water flush gate
- Don't use sliding pads, tubes, toys or similar things in the slide
- Use caution and hand rails when entering and stepping over the flush gate
- Watch the previous slider make a run and exit the slide. Next slider shouldn't start until slide is clear
- Do not stop and remain in the slide. If you get stuck stand up and walk to the end and jump in the pond
- Do not walk back up the slide. If you choose not to use the stairs, you and your entire group will be asked to leave

Main Platform, Diving Board and Rope Handle Swing

- Be Safe, there is a lot of activity here.
- Look before you jump, swing or dive
- Let go of the rope handle swing before it goes around by the stairs
- Non-swimmers must have life vests

<u>Upper Platform, Spiral Stair, Zip Line and Diving Board</u>

- Limit of 5 people on the stairs and upper platform. Wait on the lower level
- Make sure the water is cleared of people before you Zip, Dive or Jump
- No more than two people or 400 lbs. on the zip line at a time.
- Non-swimmers must have life vests
- The return rope wheel has an automatic drag brake to slow the wheel and keep it from unnecessary discharge of rope at the end of each Zip. If this is not working properly it needs to be adjusted to have a minimal drag.
- The Zip handle will regularly flip over the cable. When this happens, return the handle slowly and steadily back to the tower and flip the handle over the cable making sure the return rope is untangled and in proper operating position (not over cable) before each Zip

Canoes, Boats, Floating Docks, Tubes, etc.

- Treat water craft and equipment with care
- Do not run into other canoes
- Don't mistreat paddles. They are a regularly damaged item
- Replace canoes upside down on canoe racks when done
- Paddles need to be stored in the paddle barrel near racks
- Life vests are mandatory for non-swimmers and encouraged for all
- Keep all water craft out of congested activity areas
