A Yearly Ride to Honor Our Veterans

I am a Vietnam Veteran with PTSD. I, like many thousand of Veterans, have struggled for many years to try to deal with the aftereffects of War on a person. When I retired in 2002 from full time employment, a person I know told me I need to ride with other Veterans to the Wall in DC. She said they gather in California and ride to DC for Memorial Day and the Rolling Thunder Protest Rally on our Nations Capital. So, a few months prior to my May 1, 2002 retirement date, I decided to put the wheels in motion to give this a try. I had a Yamaha Venture Royal at that time and had never ridden more than two days at a time.

As I talked to my friends who had big bikes, they all agreed I needed a bigger and more comfortable bike. It just so happened that my back surgeon (who had just released me to return to work) told me of a bike called a Gold Wing. Up until that time I was unaware of a Gold Wing, so I went looking for this machine. The shop I was buying bikes from at that time just happened to have a 99 Wing just in on trade. When I went to ride, it the battery was dead so home I went. About two weeks later the owner of the shop Rick called and told me to come get this bike, take it home and ride it, so I did. I had the wife take me to his shop and off I was on this big bulky machine. That was a Tuesday. Friday Rick called and wondered what had happened to me and that Wing. I told him I had never ridden anything like that and asked him what he was asking...Well the rest is history. Two days later, I went and paid for that bike, and even bought a trailer (which at that time I never knew there was such a thing as a trailer to pull behind a cycle).

Remember, I talked about retiring May 1, well that day came and went as I was dealing on this bike, so May 1st I retired from John Deere, May 3rd I bought a 99 Wing, and May 8th my wife and I and five other Veterans left Des Moines, IA on our ride to California to join up with a thing called Run For The Wall. Until this time, I had never traveled across county on a bike, let alone two up towing a trailer. One person who was with us had all of us take turns riding in different positions together, training us for what we were in for when we left California (as at that time RFTW rode two up and tight at 65 miles a hour). Well to put it into words is to this day hard to do, as that was the best three weeks of my life. With my wife at my side we traveled over 5,000 miles visiting Veterans school children and just people who support Veterans. That three weeks changed my life forever. I knew then that we were appreciated for what we went through in Vietnam, and there are people who really care about our health and well being, and the other thing I immediately realized was that many of my friends who were suffering the effects of PTSD needed to do this and become involved in this kind of comraderie even if they didn't ride a bike.

Remember that was May 2002, so in the next two years myself and many others planned and plotted to get a Northern Route, as at that time there was a Southern and Central route. So with some help from a guy from Michigan City, Indiana (Headdog) and a guy from Chicago (Recon) we set out to split up the country from Sacramento to DC and each of us took several states and planned a route. Now you must remember not only do you have to plan a route to take, but you must also plan a time schedule and visits to Vets Homes, VA Hospitals, and a few schools to educate the children. This I might add seemed a big task to take on, but you must remember some of us had a little experience (me) and others had a lot more (Headdog, Recon) but I had a will and that was driving me on.

Well to make this story a little shorter, we did it. In May of 2005 we started what is known in ride circles as a Recon run to see if our plan was workable, and I am pleased to tell you it was with a few hiccups, we made it and kept pretty close to schedule. Now that I told you all that I want to tell you about the ride, how we help Veterans across this country, how when we get to some hospitals and

forward to our visit each year. How three of us had the HONOR last year to be with a Vet who didn't want to die alone, we stayed with him until he passed and how the nurse told us how he was waiting for us to come to be with him. Stories like this are commonplace on our ride, the children so much want to talk with us to learn of our experiences and tell us thank you. It truly is heart warming.

I am a Vietnam Vet, who has been struggling for years prior to this with being a survivor when so many of my fellow Veterans died in the Nam, wondering what I could do to get my head on straight--well, I found it. As I said the 05 Recon Run was a success and so we decided to do it again, and again, and again. Once you make this ride you will come back, if your job (and your wife) will allow you, you will be back again, and again, and again. I and others can't wait until May every year. The joke is when we get to DC several of us say OK lets go back to California and do it again NOW.

We travel across this country on a motorcycle (here I am preaching to the choir) we stop at least once a day to visit Veterans or a school. I am from Iowa and as we were planning this ride I was fortunate to have the ride two days in Iowa. We enter Iowa at 11 am on a Sunday morning, in Council Bluffs, and leave it on a Tuesday Morning from Davenport. While here we visit the Patriot Rock, the Iowa Veterans Cemetery, the VA Hospital in Des Moines, and Iowa City, with a stop in Marshalltown at the Iowa Veterans Home for a visit and lunch.

The last thing I want to say before I leave you with our web site where you can get an hour by hour schedule of our ride, telling you where we will be at each stop, and for how long and who we will visit there is the fact that I have had the enormous privilege of leading this ride for the last three years, and will get that privilege again this year. I want to tell you Veterans out there who are suffering the effects of PTSD that this is your ride, come with us, you will never forget it. To the many of you who are not Veterans or who are peace time Veterans, come join us. You too will bond with our group like you have never bonded with anyone before. It is a life changing experience. We ride for those who can't, we ride to honor and respect Veterans who have served, who have given their all to this country, and we ride to educate the children of this country that FREEDOM IS NOT FREE. Children who currently have a loved one serving or have had a loved one lost in service to this country so much want to talk to other Veterans to bond with you. Because they know that there is no bond like that of a family or a loved one who has served, is serving or has died in service to this great country.

Members of my GWRRA Chapter in Ottumwa, Iowa have been after me to write to you about my ride, but I have felt that not many would be interested in my story. But a few years ago a Member of our Chapter died from the residuals of Agent Orange Exposure while he was in the Nam, and I felt it was time to honor his memory and tell the world of GWRRA that we Vietnam Veterans take it personal when one of our own passes on.
