Chicken Tortilla Crockpot Soup

1 lb shredded, cooked chicken

1 (10oz) can enchilada sauce

1 (4oz) can chopped green chiles 2 cups water

1 teaspoon cumin 1 teaspoon salt 1 bay leaf

1 tablespoon chopped cilantro vegetable oil

1 (15oz) can whole peeled tomatoes mashed

1 medium onion, chopped

2 cloves garlic, minced 1 (14.5oz) can chicken broth

1 teaspoon chili powder 1/4 teaspoon black pepper

1 (10oz) package frozen corn

7 corn tortillas

The Cooking Corner



Directions:

Place chicken, tomatoes, enchilada sauce, onion, green chiles and garlic into a slow cooker. Pour in water and chicken broth, and season with cumin, chili powder, salt, pepper and bay leaf. Stir in corn and cilantro. Cover and cook on LOW setting for 6 to 8 hours or on HIGH setting for 3 to 4 hours.

Preheat oven to 400 degrees

Lightly brush both sides of tortillas with oil.

Cut tortillas into strips, then spread on a baking sheet.

Bake in preheated oven until crisp, about 10 to 15 minutes.

To serve, sprinkle tortilla strips over soup.
