6th Annual FREEDOM SCHOLARSHIP ESSAY Contest

A major objective of this contest is to assist our college bound recent High School graduates in the Milwaukee area to better understand where their paths lead. We hope that this contest will help our youth appreciate the sacrifice that African-American men and women of our past have made, and recognize their duty to continue the legacy of freedom through their activism and vigilance.

2013 Scholarship Essay Contest Topic

Students responding to this year's writing contest should analyze the concept of "freedom" and then, in a essay of no more than 1000 words: (a) analyze why it is so vital that the remembrance, history and lessons of freedom be passed to a new generation; and (b) suggest what they, as students, can do to combat and prevent prejudice, discrimination and violence in our world today. See contest rules below for complete details and submission requirements.

In preparation for writing, students should research information from a variety of sources to assist them in the study of the celebration of freedom. Primary and secondary source material could include: historical and reference material; interviews; oral testimonies; official documents and other primary sources; readings from diaries, letters, autobiographies and works of poetry; video or audiotapes, films, art, CD-ROM and Internet sources.

Eligibility

To be eligible all students must be City of Milwaukee residents and recent high school graduates (2011, 2012, 2013) who attended a public, private, parochial school, home school, or are participating in a high school correspondence program in the City of Milwaukee. Preference will be given to residents in the 6th District.

Students who are not planning to attend a two or four year college in the fall of 2013 are not eligible.

RULES AND GUIDELINES

- 1. Submit four copies of an original work in English on the designated topic. Include with your essay, title page, numbered and sources. Creative writing is encouraged.
- 2. Submit four copies of a comprehensive list of sources consulted, as well as one completed registration form signed by you.
- **3.** All submissions must include a word count, excluding the list of sources and the registration form.
- **4.** Entries must be typed, double-spaced, in 12-point Times New Roman or an equivalent font with a one-inch margin on all sides of the page.
- **5.** Attach and staple one registration form to your completed essay.
- **6.** Must include a copy of acceptance letter or transcript.
- 7. Must include a copy of a photo ID (i.e. student ID, drivers license, state ID)
- **8.** You must include your name, home address, and phone number. You must sign this registration form.
- 9. E-MAILED OR FAXED APPLICATIONS ARE NOT ACCEPTABLE!
- **10.** Do not place your name or your school's name on any of the pages of the essay.
- 11. Your essay will be disqualified if it does not meet the requirements or is postmarked after the submission date of **August 9, 2013**.
