#### Dear Educator:

Columbia State Historic Park offers a program addressing the California State Curriculum Standards for 4<sup>th</sup> grade. The program consists of:

- An 1861 classroom presentation at the historic school house
- An In-Town presentation -- history of Columbia, interactive talk and bucket brigade

Reservations for this program can be scheduled using these guidelines:

- September through February 16<sup>th</sup>
  - Schoolhouse and In-Park Programs available Wednesdays and Thursdays
- February 17<sup>th</sup>-May
  - Schoolhouse and In-Park Programs available Monday-Thursday
- Available at 10 AM, 11 AM, 1 PM, 2 PM
- Every month except July & August (Some dates may be available in June)
- Reservations are processed starting on August 15<sup>th</sup>
- Reservations are accepted until January 31, 2014, or until sold out, whichever comes first.
- <u>Print out and save your confirmation letter sent to you via e-mail. It must be presented</u> <u>upon arrival.</u>

Students must be accompanied by a certified teacher with one adult for every five students attending. Adults are responsible for discipline. Each presentation is limited to <u>39 people total</u>, including the teacher in charge, the chaperones and a maximum of **32** students. Please note the following:

- A \$40 <u>NON-REFUNDABLE</u> fee covers both programs for <u>one</u> class. (Sorry, no refunds!)
- Make checks payable to: Friends of Columbia State Historic Park.
- Reservations received without a check will not be processed.
- Reservations are by <u>MAIL ONLY</u>, using the forms enclosed.
- One form needs to be submitted for <u>each class</u>.
- Read forms carefully and fill in **all** sections completely.
- Return forms, and check, with a self-addressed, **stamped**, business-size envelope for your confirmation and receipt of payment.
- We require that each student wear a tag identifying the school.
- In the case of rain, an indoor program may be substituted for the bucket brigade.
- Only service animals are permitted during the scheduled programs.
- Appropriate 1850-60's attire for the students is encouraged.

Please be aware that March, April and May programs fill very early.

All reservation forms received by August 15<sup>th</sup> will be processed in lottery order. After August 15<sup>th</sup>, they will be processed in the order received.
