SPRING Cleanup

The Yellow Breeches Watershed Association (YBWA) has scheduled a stream cleanup project for **Saturday, April 8, 2006**, from 8:00 a.m. until noon. **Volunteers are needed!** Several locations in Lower Allen Township along the Yellow Breeches Creek and a tributary, Cedar Run, will be improved by your efforts.

This event is being organized by YBWA, with assistance provided by Lower Allen Township. The project sponsors are PPL Corporation and the Susquehanna River Basin Commission. The purpose of the event is to improve the streamside appearance and environment by removing trash, litter and other debris from the water, stream banks and floodplain area.

Volunteers, please report to: Lower Allen Township Public Works Building, 1400 S. St. Johns Road at 8:00 a.m. on Saturday, April 8, 2006. You can access S. St. Johns Road from Slate Hill Road via Appleton Street (at former Appleton Paper Plant) or from Lisburn Road (just east of Country Walk Apartments). You will sign in and receive instructions, assignments and materials. Volunteers will then drive to the various stream locations to be cleaned up. The cleanups are expected to be completed by noon.

While volunteers of all ages are welcome, children under the age of 12 must be accompanied by an adult. All minors must have a parent or guardian complete a participation form.

PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

This year marks the 5th Anniversary of the Yellow Breeches Watershed Association – supporting environmental resource management and stewardship in the watershed. The organization began in early 2001 thanks to the initiative and vision of several of the founding board members, the support of Lower Allen Township, and a Growing Greener planning grant from PADEP. An initial stakeholders meeting was held in January of 2001 and a planning committee was formed. The first public meeting was held in February 2001 followed by the filing of articles of incorporation with an effective date of April 18, 2001 - the official anniversary date.

Much progress has been made in 5 years and a lot of credit goes to the members, volunteers, and other partners that have actively participated in various initiatives. A significant accomplishment was the completion of a Watershed Assessment and Rivers Conservation Plan project last year thanks to grants received from DEP and DCNR. This project was a major focus of the organization for several years and as a result has created much interest and provides the basis for many of the current initiatives within the watershed.

At the annual membership meeting in October 2005, the mission and goals of the organization were reviewed and the proposed goals/priorities for 2006 were presented that also included a proposed restructuring of committees. The Board of Directors approved the organization goals and revised committee structure/priorities for 2006 at the January meeting. Information on the revised committee structure, chairpersons and activities is included with this newsletter.

A few of the priority goals for 2006 include: the designation and establishment of a water trail in partnership with Cumberland County (see public meeting announcement); membership recruitment and growth; increase publicity and outreach activities; and continue monitoring activities and partnering with other organizations including initiatives on Cedar Run, Trout Run, Dogwood Run, and Mountain Creek.

This year is shaping up to be very exciting and challenging. In celebration of the 5th year anniversary, many activities are being planned. Please refer to the calendar of events for 2006. If you are an active member of the organization, I thank you. If not, I ask that you seriously consider becoming actively involved with one of the committees or volunteer to help with one or more of the planned activities or events this year. Also, please consider inviting someone you know to become a new member of YBWA. With your help, I am confident that the organization will continue to grow and accomplish great things to benefit the Yellow Breeches Watershed.

I am pleased to continue to serve as President for a second year and look forward to a very successful and rewarding year.

Land Partnerships: Cumberland County's Smart Growth and Open Space Preservation Plan

YBWA has completed a four-year assignment on the Cumberland County Open Space Steering Committee that assisted in drafting the open space preservation plan. The *Land Partnerships* plan is intended to provide a blueprint to help the County achieve a healthy balance between preservation and development. It identifies important features and suggests strategies and policies to protect those resources for current and future generations.

The planning process consisted of six steps:

1. Inventory and mapping of agricultural, natural, recreational and cultural resources.
2. Assessment of public opinion and level of support for open space preservation.
3. Creation of a vision.
4. Formation of goals and objectives to achieve the vision.
5. Development of conclusions and strategies regarding open space preservation and smart growth.
6. Establishment of an action plan and schedule to implement the recommendations.

The draft plan is open for public comment until April 3, 2006. It can be viewed at the Cumberland County Planning Commission office located at 18 North Hanover Street, Carlisle or on the County website, www.ccpa.net/planning (see Greenway & Open Space Preservation Initiatives).

The County Open Space effort is currently supporting and funding the proposed Yellow Breeches Creek Water Trail.

Spring Cleanup

YBWA will supply gloves, vests, trash bags, snacks and drinks for the volunteers. Dress appropriately for a stream cleanup. Expect your footwear to get wet and muddy. Water entry will be limited, depending upon stream conditions and safety considerations; however, volunteers with hip or

knee length boots would be very helpful to remove items that are in the water. Feel free to bring any cleanup tools you would find helpful.
