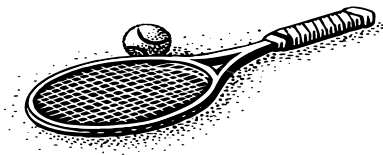
"Colleen has developed partnerships all around Clark County allowing our students to experience firsthand what it takes to be involved the medical profession," said Principal Scott Parker.

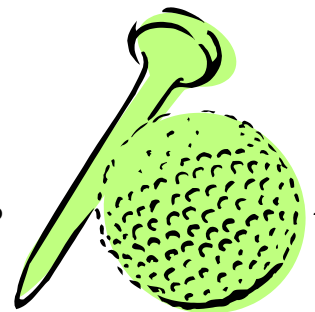

Players are expected to attend summer workouts unless they are out of town! In addition, all 10-12 graders for next year are expected to go to football camp. WELDING WORKS

The FVHS Welding and Fabrication program has had a busy month. The class built metal trees for the theater department's play, complete with crystal green glitter paint. They completed a feasibility study for building new lab stools for both the culinary and chemistry programs at a greatly reduced cost versus the commercial product. The next batch of metals shop brightly colored identity wear has been ordered and the students have completed a job that will provide the means to do the program's traditional year end BBQ.

The class took a field trip to Vigor Industrial's shipyard on Swan Island and established a partnership with Pedigo Manufacturing locally in Vancouver, to assist in training students to work with thin gauge stainless steel.

Five seniors are scheduled to have their welds tested by a lab to grant them the title of Certified Welder, right out of high school.

The Summer HSPE tests in Reading and Writing will be administered August 12-14 at Skyview High School. Any student that has not passed one or both of these tests should plan on attending. The Writing test will be offered August 12th and 13th starting at 8:30 a.m., and the Reading test will be offered August 14th, also at 8:30 a.m. Bus transportation from Fort Vancouver High School will be available. The bus will depart Fort at 7:30 a.m. so students should plan to be at the school no later than 7:25 a.m. the morning of the test.

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Math and Biology End-of-Course (EOC) assessments are rapidly approaching. These tests will be administered June 3-5. Students in the 2015 graduating class and beyond must pass the Biology exam and one of the Math exams in order to graduate. Students must attempt each test at least twice before being allowed to access alternative options for the tests. Please make certain that your student is in attendance on these dates.

If your student is currently enrolled in a PLATO online-learning class in order to recover credit, please be aware that they have until the end of the semester (June 19) to complete the work for the course. Students that do not complete the course work by that date will not earn credit in the course. Check in with your student and find out how they are progressing with their class.

Additional academic support is available to Trapper students through a variety of programs. Students can use PRTI time on Tuesdays and Thursdays to get additional assistance in courses they are struggling with, make up tests, or simply work on assignments. There is also Homework Help available after school from 2:15-3:15 in the school's Media Center. Many of our teachers also allow students to make up missed work or offer before or after school office hours to assist students.

Counselors will be out of the building from June 24 until August 18 for the Summer Break. You may still leave email messages for the counselors at the email addresses listed above. We will be checking our inboxes periodically and attempt to return messages in as timely a manner as possible.
