## From the Principal's desk:

Dear NME Parents (1st - 5th grade),

The last few months have certainly been interesting (and admittedly trying) with regard to changing budgetary impacts, Title I, and Focus school designation from the state. In fact, I have just learned even more specific details from state officials regarding Title I requirements and Focus schools. In short, funding realities and state mandates have required us to reevaluate our programs and services to our students, especially with regard to Title I. (Title I supports students who are identified through a variety of possible assessments.)

We want you to know, however, that all students who qualify for Title I will receive services this school year at NME. We appreciate your patience and understanding as we navigate the best way to proceed given the resources and information we have available to us. Some Title I service letters have been sent to individual students' parents already; others will be notified very soon.

We are finally getting to some points of clarity, based upon funding, mandates, and data, that will allow us to structure our program most effectively. Most importantly, our multiple points of data indicate needs that must be met for many of our students. Through a collaborative effort, we are confident that we can provide a solid system of supports for all of our students.

Please contact me directly if you have specific questions or concerns. Again, thank you for your patience while we navigate the changes and challenges before us. I am optimistic that together we can transform these challenges into an opportunity to make our program even stronger than it already is!

What is sleep? Every creature needs to rest. Just like eating, sleep is necessary for survival. Sleep gives your body rest and allows it to prepare for the next day—it gives your body a mini vacation. Sleep is especially important for your brain. During the school year, we do lots of school work that requires our brain to work really hard. The more sleep we have the better our brain works. When your body doesn't have enough rest, you may feel cranky, or you may be unable to think clearly. You might even have a hard time following directions, or have an argument with a friend over something really silly. Most kids between the ages of 5 and 12 need 10—11 hours of sleep each night. Sleep keeps you from getting sick and gives your body time to grow.

Here are some tips to help you get a good nights sleep:

- "Try to go to bed at the same time every night. This helps your body get into a routine.
- "Follow a bedtime routine that is calming, such as taking a warm bath or reading a book.
- "Limit food and drinks that have caffeine in them. This would include things like pop, tea and chocolate.
- "Turn off your computer and other electronic devices. You should stop using these things at least an hour before you go to bed. You need calm down not get excited over playing a game. Also, don't have a TV in your room. If you do, turn the TV off when you go to sleep.
- "Don't watch scary things on TV or read scary books before bed. It might make it hard for you to fall asleep.
- "Don't exercise before you go to bed. Exercising during the earlier part of day is better.
- "If you have had a hard day at school and something is bothering you, talk it over with your Mom or Dad. They can help you solve any problems you have before you go to bed, and you'll get a better night's sleep.

Remember to do your best on the MEAP Test you should get a good night's sleep the night before, eat a healthy breakfast and take time each day to play. 


