Registration and Training Policy

Register early as many trainings fill up prior to the workshop. Due to space constraints and presenter contracts, we may be unable to accept additional or walk-in registration. Participants will receive confirmation via email to confirm their registration. To register for workshops, complete the registration form (attached) and mail with payment prior to registration deadline. No phone registrations accepted.

Complete the entire registration form. Due to the data tracking requirements, incomplete registrations will not be processed and the applicant will not be registered. Incomplete registrations will be returned. Remember to sign and date the bottom of the registration form.

All registration fees are non-refundable. Participants must notify Child Care Resource & Referral Network within three business days of the scheduled training session if they choose to send someone in their place. A certificate will not be provided to anyone not listed on the workshop roster the night of the training. Training fees cannot be transferred to another training session.

Make a conscientious effort to attend the FREE training sessions for which you register. If you are registered for a free training and fail to attend or cancel your registration less than three business days in advance, a no-show will be reported on your training record.

If a training is cancelled due to low enrollment or presenter conflicts, notification will be made to all registered participants by phone, email or mail. We consider low enrollment as 6 or less.

Certificates will not be given out to participants who arrive late, leave early, or are disruptive. A 15 minute grace period is given at the beginning of a training session. To receive a training certificate, participants must be present until the trainer is finished. Child Care Resource and Referral Network training sessions are for adults only unless otherwise noted. Replacement certificates must be requested by the individual who attended the training. There is a \$5 certificate replacement fee.

CCRRN requests that all training participants refrain from using their cell phone during training sessions. We would ask participants to come to trainings ready to engage in the learning process.

The NAP SACC program is a research-tested intervention designed to enhance policies, practices and environments in child care by improving:

- Amount and quality of physical activity
- Staff-child interactions
- Facility nutrition and physical activity policies and practices and related environmental characteristics

Program for Infant Toddler Care (PITC)

Module 1: Social-Emotional Growth and Socialization

Barbara Ross -Lowery, Infant/Toddler Specialist

Description: Module 1 begins with an overview of the basic concepts of early social-emotional growth and socialization and their application to the group care context. An emphasis is placed on the development of a nurturing relationship between the infant and caregiver. The overview addresses the importance of responsive caregiving, the individualization of care through an understanding of infant temperament, the critical role of family and culture in early identify development and stages of emotional development. Completion of all 4 modules earns credit toward Infant/Toddler Credential

Level One Module 7A Child Development (Birth to 8 Months)

Cara McMorris, ITN Trainer

Description: Newborns and young babies are developing at an incredible rate, causing them to have special needs unlike older children. In this class you'll understand how children from birth to 8 months learn and grow, and how to individualize their care accordingly.

CPR/First Aid

Description: Come and learn how to provide First Aid and CPR to adults, children and infants. The certification is good for 2 years thru the American Heart Association.

Level One Module 7B Child Growth and Development (8 Months to 18 Months) Cara McMorris, ITN Trainer

You'll identify how this age group differs in growth and their approach to learning, and you'll discover toys, games and songs that are helpful and just right for development.

You'll identify characteristics of social and emotional development and learn techniques for promoting appropriate and effective discipline for preschool children.

Level One Module 8B Preschool Age Child Physical Development Cara McMorris. ITN Trainer

Description: As toddlers mature, their minds aren't the only things growing at an incredible rate. You'll understand the special areas of physical development in preschool-aged children. You also will learn about fine motor activities that will help preschoolers grow into their bodies while developing proper coordination and movement.

Diapering and Handwashing for Child Care Providers

The BAS is designed to complement the Family Child Care Environment Rating Scale (FCCERS).

Getting Ready for the Program Administration Scale

Description: This training is for the center based program administrators and provide an overview of the Program Administration Scale (PAS). PAS measures the quality of leadership and management practices of centered based programs. After completing this training, participants will be able to use the tool for program self-assessment and improvement planning. The PAS is designed to complement the Environmental Rating Scale. (ERS)

Program for Infant/Toddler Care (PITC)- Module 2 Group Care

Barbara Ross -Lowery, Infant/Toddler Consultant

Description: This module introduces special considerations in caring for infant/toddlers and six program polices that support the development of emotionally secure relationships in the group care setting. Module 2 explore the positive impact of responsive caregiving routines, well-designed learning environment, and individualized care on the well-being and development of children birth to three. Attention is also given to how the policies of primary care, small groups, continuity of care, individualization of care, culturally responsive care, and inclusive care of children with special needs provide the foundation for high quality infant/toddler

Foundations of Family Child Care

Welcoming Each and Every Child

Description: This course provides information on caring for children with special needs in typical child care settings. The training helps increase the knowledge and comfort level of participants to enhance their ability to care for young children with disabilities in early childhood environments. 
