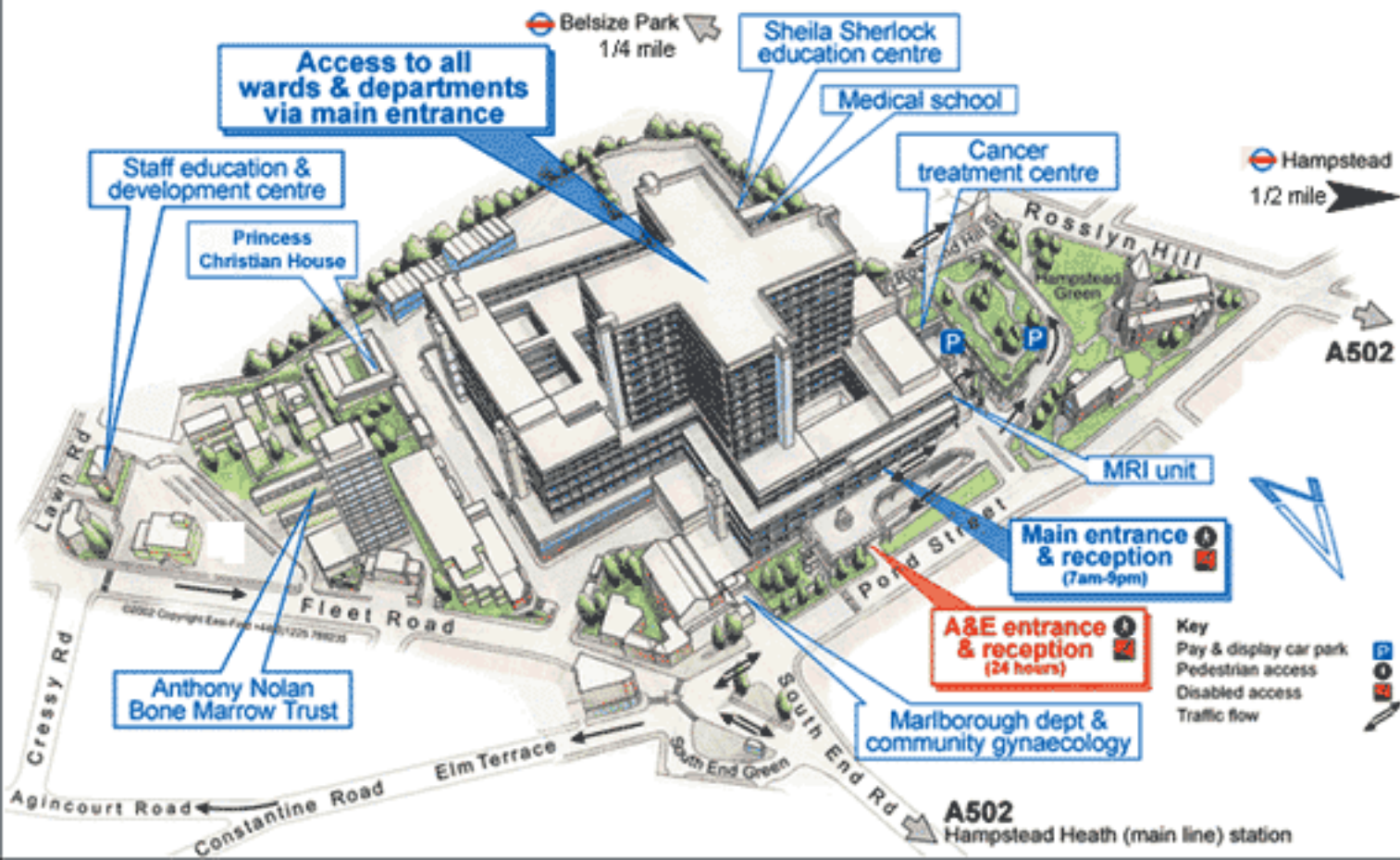

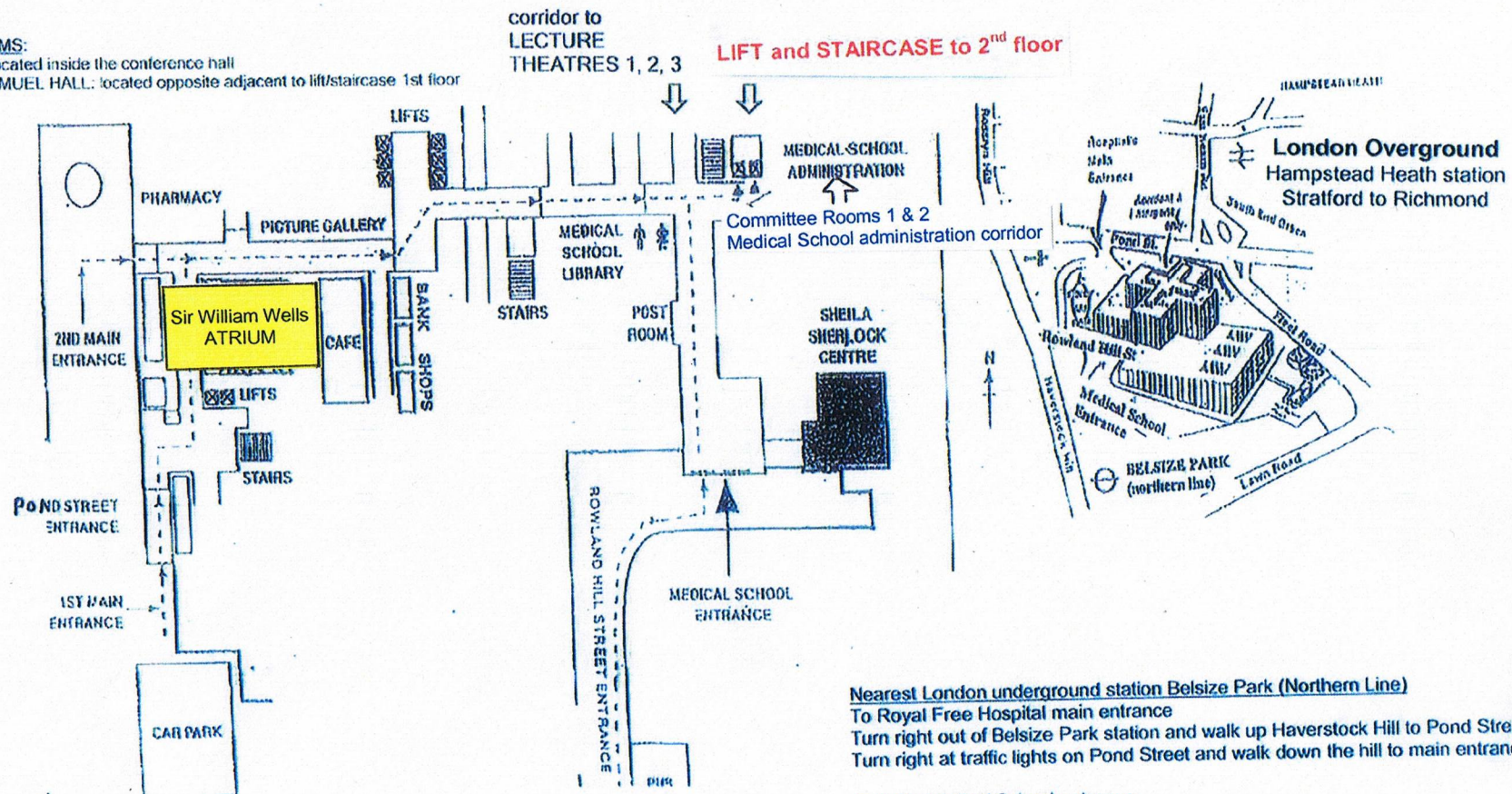

To Royal Free Hospital main entrance

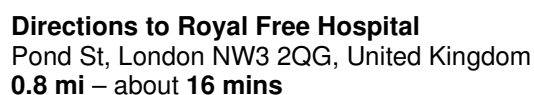
Turn right out of Belsize Park station and walk up Haverstock Hill to Pond Street

Turn right at traffic lights on Pond Street and walk down the hill to main entrance of hospital

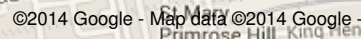
To UCL Medical School entrance
