2. What are the main accomplishments/tasks that the Curriculum Committee achieved this academic year?

Main accomplishments for 2010-2011: Between Fall 2010 and Spring 2011, we went from having less than 20% of our course outlines in ECD to over 75% by the end of the academic year.

The following items are still in progress: Having 100% of our course outlines updated and in ECD.

Goals members believe the Curriculum Committee **should accomplish during 2011-2012:** 100% of our course outlines updated and in ECD; review of the associate degree general education plans; style guideline for the course outline of record

The committee's review of course outlines ensures that we meet the diverse needs of our students (1.3); our review and approval of new courses that are aimed at improving student success in basic skills and moving them toward college-level studies (Statway, Math 228A and B) (2.3); our course outlines contain an element asking the faculty to identify the diversity component of their curriculum, if applicable (3.3); implantation of the LACCD Electronic Curriculum Development system to house and track all course outlines and monitor our curriculum approval process (*Goal 4: Pierce College will expand the effective use of technology in all areas of the college*);
