History and purpose

The Asian American Law Librarians Caucus (AALLc) was organized at the 1988 American Association of Law Libraries (AALL) Annual Meeting in Chicago by Mon Yin Lung.

The purposes of the caucus include:

- To provide a forum for the exchange of ideas and information and to represent its members' interests and concerns within AALL.
- To promote law librarianship and the study of Asian law.
- To develop and increase the effectiveness of Asian American law librarians.
- To foster cooperation among Asian American members of the profession.
- To provide for the further continuing education of Asian American law librarians.

Activities and Committees

AALLc sponsors thematic programs at the AALL Annual Meeting. It holds its business meeting at each AALL Annual meeting which traditionally includes a social event held at a local restaurant, an education program, and occasional tours of libraries and museums.

AALLc also supports the Asian Law Working Group of the Foreign, Comparative & International Law SIS to facilitate access of Asian legal materials in both English and Asian vernacular languages.
