- Next he completes a "dummy" tax return, omitting his taxable need based scholarship (subtotal 3 from worksheet). Without the scholarship, he would have been due a \$51.80 refund.
- Robb contacts the tax desk to request a check for \$736.20 to be paid to the IRS and to have Student Accounts credit his account with the \$51.80, which he would have received from the IRS if he didn't have taxable scholarship.
