### The Baguio Convention Center

The Baguio Convention Center (BCC) was conceived by then First Lady and Minister of Human Settlements and Ecology, Mrs. Imelda Romualdez – Marcos and realized with the aid of then President Ferdinand E. Marcos through GSIS.

The 5,000 sq.m. facility sits on a 4.86 hectares estate right in the center of a growing metropolis, was formally opened on July 17, 1978. As a convention facility, the BCC was venue to big congress such as the Philippine Advertising Congress, National Congress for Municipal Judges, National Accountants Congress, among others. Arts and Cultural exhibits likewise were held in the facility

In 1995, the facility was officially leased to the City Government of Baguio through (Ordinance 07-95). Ownership of the facility was finally realized upon the signing of an agreement between Camp John Hay, GSIS and the City Government of Baguio in February 18, 2003.

# The City of Baguio

Once a vast grassland, a pasture to hundreds of herds of cattle that far outnumbered the people, is now a bastion of new age monuments that continue to alter the city's skyline.

Early documented explorations by the Spanish Conquistadors, aiming to extend the King's Throne to far reaching regions in the Philippine Islands, led to the mestizos' mission to the Cordilleran boondocks. The Spaniards established a Commandencia in the Benguet valley of La Trinidad with 31-rancherias, among which is the mnor Rancheria (about 20 houses) called *Kafagway*. Kafagway later became "Baguio", after the native "Bag-iw", meaning moss.

The Americans succeeded the Spaniards and in 1900, established the first provincial government in Benguet. By resolution of the Philippine Commission, Baguio was declared "Summer Capital" on June 1, 1903.

The City is a strategic gateway to the wonders of Northern Luzon. The calm beaches of La Union; the fabled Hundred Islands of Pangasinan; the world famous Banaue Rice Terraces in Ifugao; the ancient churches, Spanish influenced houses, historical and cultural relics of Ilocos Sur and Ilocos Norte, the Kabayan of the tribes of Benguet, Mountain Province, Ifugao, Kalinga Apayao

Baguio has a unique environment that is relatively cooler by an average of 10-degrees Celsius and likewise unique because of the abundance of the Benguet Pine (pinus insularis). As such, it has become a favorite destination for nature revelers and those that find the lowland heat hard to take.

Dubbed the "Education Center of the North" it is home to many brilliant minds who find the weather conducive for learning among a wide array of outstanding universities and colleges.
