CELBAN Scores and Test Results

All CELBAN tests are scored by <u>two</u> trained independent CELBAN assessors. Scores are then compared to ensure accuracy of scoring. The scores are then converted to CLB levels.

CELBAN Listening and Reading:

All CELBAN Listening tests and Reading tests are scored by **two** independent scorers. The raw score (number correct out of total number of questions) obtained is converted to a percentage; ranges of percentages are then converted to CLB levels.

For example:

CELBAN Listening:	CELBAN Reading:
90-100% = CLB level 10	92-100% = CLB level 10
82- 89% = CLB level 9	83- 91% = CLB level 9
75- 81% = CLB level 8	74- 82% = CLB level 8
	65- 73% = CLB level 7

It is important to note that a CLB level represents a range of scores, not just 1 point.

- If a candidate achieves a CLB level 9 on **CELBAN Listening**, instead of the required CLB level 10, his or her score could be in the **low range** (82-84%), **mid-range** (85-87%) or **high range** (88-89%) of CLB level 9.
- If a candidate achieves a CLB level 7 on **CELBAN Reading**, instead of the required CLB level 8, his or her score could be in the **low range** (65-67%), **mid-range** (68-70%) or **high range** (71-73%) of CLB level 7.

When a candidate requests a rescore because he or she achieved a CLB level 9 in CELBAN Listening OR a CLB level 7 in CELBAN Reading, <u>it is highly unlikely</u> that his or her score will change. It is highly unlikely that **two** independent scorers made a mistake in calculating the raw score, and the percentage score, and the conversion to a CLB level.

CELBAN Speaking and Writing:

All CELBAN Speaking tests and Writing tests are scored by **two** independent scorers. In CELBAN Speaking there are nine criteria used in scoring; in CELBAN Writing, there are six criteria used in scoring (two on Task A and four on Task B). Each criterion is assigned a CLB level, and the complete test is assigned an overall CLB level.

It is important to note that a CLB level represents a range of scores, not just 1 point.

- If a candidate achieves a CLB level 7 on **CELBAN Speaking**, instead of the required level 8, his or her score could be in the **low range** (6.8-7.0), **mid-range** (7.1-7.4) or **high range** (7.5-7.7) of CLB level 7.
- If a candidate achieves a CLB level 6 in **CELBAN Writing**, instead of the required CLB level 7, his or her score could be in the **low range** (5.8-6.0), **mid-range** (6.1-6.4) or **high range** (6.5-6.7) of CLB level 6.

If a candidate who achieved a CLB level 6 in writing OR a CLB level 7 in speaking requests a rescore, and the original test was scored in the high range, <u>it is possible</u> that a rescore will result in an increased level; however, if the original test was in the **low range** or **mid-range**, <u>it is highly</u> <u>unlikely</u> that **two** independent scorers made a mistake in calculating the final CLB level.
