This year we are able to offer more clubs than ever, both after school and at lunchtimes. After school clubs will need an expression of interest/permission form to be signed (see below):-

#### **Lunchtime Clubs**

#### **After School Clubs**

• Friends and Heroes - Mondays from 12<sup>th</sup> September, Years 2-6 This club is run by The Bridge at no cost. We have done a lot of work with the Bridge and they regularly support RE, Personal and Social education and deliver assemblies.

Friends and Heroes is based around an animated adventure series for children featuring amazing 3D Bible Stories. It centres on the tale of two young people - Macky and Portia - whose friendship leads them across the ancient world, from the fabled Egyptian port of Alexandria, to the besieged city of Jerusalem and finally, to the very heart of the Empire: Rome. As they fight for justice and even survival against the might of the Roman Empire, they become friends and then, in turn, heroes!

Martial Arts – Mondays from 21<sup>st</sup> September, Years 1 - 6

After a very successful first year, this year we are able to extend the age range for this club to Years 1-6. The cost will depend on numbers of children but is likely to be around £2.50 a session with a minimum of 8 children to make it viable.

 Cookery Club – Tuesdays from 13<sup>th</sup> September, rotation through school Years 1 -6, starting with Year 1

We would like to run this club once more with Mrs Biddle. The Healthy Schools Plus funding has now been used so there will now be a cost attached of £12.50 for the whole course. Each year group will have 5 sessions, but there will only be places for 6-8 children, so it is quite likely that a draw will have to be made for those places. We will be starting with Year 1 who will receive an information letter today.

• Juniors' Football Club – Wednesdays from 23<sup>rd</sup> September, Years 3-6

Darren Crooke will be running sessions for Years 3-6 on Wednesdays at a cost of £2.50 per child, but there will need to be at least 10 children a week to make this viable.

#### Drama Club – Thursdays from 15<sup>th</sup> September, Years 3-6

This very popular club continues this year with Mrs Harvey and Mrs White.
