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Annual Spring Clean Up Weeks May 3-14, 2010



The Brownstown Beautification Commission has announced that the weeks of May 3-7 and May 10-14 are Annual Spring Clean Up Weeks. During Spring Clean Up, Waste Management will accept, on your regular trash pick-up days, unlimited household rubbish and many items normally not accepted. Items accepted include small car parts, appliances with freon(schedule pickup w/Waste Mgt 1-800-296-9696), unlimited household rubbish, yard waste and bulky items. Tires will be accepted in a dumpster at Twp Hall only.

During Spring Clean Up please make sure all items are placed at the curb in 32 gallon or smaller containers or bags. Bundle all loose items in 3 foot or smaller bundles weighing no

more than 50 pounds.

YARD WASTE COLLECTIONS BEGIN MARCH 29

The collection of yard waste along with your regular trash pick up will begin the week of March 29, 2010 and run through the week of December 3, 2010. Yard waste should be placed on the curb on your regular collection days in separate paper bags or waste containers.

State law prohibits the depositing of yard waste in land fills. Yard waste is: Grass Clippings, Leaves, Garden Debris, Shrub and Brush Trimmings under 2" in diameter. Yard waste is NOT: Sod, Pet Waste, Logs, Dirt, Stumps or Branches over 2" in diameter.

Community Center Booking 2011 Dates

The Brownstown Community Center, located at 21311 Telegraph Road is now booking group rentals through 2011. The halls can accommodate up to 323 people and a full kitchen is available.

Rental rates range from \$75.00 for groups of 50 or less on a weeknight to \$525.00 for groups of up to 323 on a weekend. Halls are dividable to accommodate any size party and rental rates vary with party size. Kitchen facilities are available for a \$50.00 charge. White table linens and clean-up services are also available for an additional charge.


The 40' x 60' shelter is equipped with 12 tables and has one electric outlet available. Capable of accommodating up to 100 people, the shelter is ideal for family reunions, company parties, and large picnics.

For larger parties, a 6 foot hooded, charcoal barbecue grill is also available for rentals. The grill may be rented at the Community Center for an \$11.00 charge with a \$50.00 security deposit.



Dog License Renewal and Rabies Clinic April 24th

All Township Dog licenses will expire on April 30, 2010. Licenses may be renewed at the Treasurer's Office for an \$8.00 fee for dogs and a \$3.00 fee for cats. After April 30th, the license fee will increase to \$16.00 for dogs and \$6.00 for cats. Proof of rabies vaccination is required for all license renewals.



If your dog is still in need of rabies shots, they will be available on Saturday, April 24, 2010 from 9:30 AM to Noon at the new Animal Control Building on Lillian Street for a fee of \$10.00 per dog. You may also purchase your license at this time. A great way to save time and get your pets shots and license in one trip!
