

# From the Pastor's Pen...



# We Have Come a Long Way. by Pastor Olaf

Recently in a meeting someone said to the pastoral team, "In our parish partnership we are much further along as I would have ever imagined we would be." Thank you "SOMEONE", you know who you are, for saying that. That statement made my day, because it means the work of everyone in our congregations is paying off.

Yes, we're still in decline. We invited people to join our church, and some of you are underwhelmed by the response. But I think that numbers are just a secondary matter. We're not salesmen and saleswomen who peddle ecclesiastic insurance that saves you from being cast into the outer darkness when the Day of Judgment comes. We don't measure success by counting heads on Sunday. Full pews are nice, but wherever two or more are gathered in Jesus name, there he will be also. We are not on a mission to fill a building, but we are called to spread the gospel so that the good news can open the hearts and minds of our neighbors to God's grace in Jesus Christ. That alone is our mission.

To fulfill this mission we have embarked on a journey. We contemplate who we are and what our institutional purpose is in this city. We opened ourselves to God's call and we are getting ready to act on that call. Doing that is no small feat and many of us have embraced it.

Of course, there are those voices who wonder why we have to do what we have never done before. Why do we have to do HOJO events? Why do we have to experiment with liturgy? Why don't we just leave everything as it is and hope for the best? I would answer; God promised us to walk with us. However, God did not promise us to do the walking for us. And, what do we have to lose?

Financial survival surely can be considered to be a benefit of our partnership, but the real benefit is not that we save money by sharing pastors, events and resources. The real benefit is that we discovered the beauty, the strength and the renewed hope that springs from being in relationship with each other. The real benefit of our parish partnership is that we have embarked on a spiritual

journey, an inner journey of transformation that changes us as much as we transform our institutional form. The church as it is right now is not relevant for an increasing number of people. The church that is on a journey of self-discovery and transformation can be relevant again, because God has put a world in our path that is hurting, that is broken and that is in dire need of good news.

The good news is that we are agents of God's grace. Moses was a stuttering refugee, but he was called by God to face up to the most powerful man in the world. He didn't want to, he didn't know how, but he did it anyway. That means, when we think about ourselves, we have to think big. We have to realize that we are not here to merely keep the doors open. We are here to change the world. We might be slightly on the older side and society does not expect us to be fire brands and revolutionaries, but we are part of a movement that always has and always will transform the status quo until God's will is done on earth as it is in heaven. Never forget, we went from lunch for lions to biggest religious movement on the face of this planet. Roughly 2.3 billion people worship the man from Galilee. Those are more people than lived on the entire earth in Jesus' time.

Here in Sudbury we don't have to face lions. We have to face secular indifference to the word of God. We fight greed, corruption, consumerism, narcissistic individualism, and eventually our own complacency. And the way we do that is by filling our parish partnership with life beyond practical considerations. In short, we love each other.

**In conclusion:** Don't worry too much about numbers and finances, and don't be afraid of change. We walk with God and when we spread the good news of God's love and grace in Jesus Christ than we have been true to our call and that is all that counts. Everything else will flow from that.



### Parish Discernment Event - No Future Without Past

On October 20th over 100 members of St. Matthew's and St. Timothy's gathered for a special service and parish meeting at the Howard Johnson Hotel to understand what is important about our churches' histories. Everyone shared faith stories and documented key words that define their and their families' personal connection to Lutheranism. These words were then collected by our Parish Council who will now develop a word cloud that will pictorially show by font size the frequency that these key words were put forward by our members.

Parish Council encourages you to provide them with your feedback on this event. They also look forward to hearing any suggestions that you may have in regard to our next discernment event planned for April 2014. The general topic of the next discernment event will be the context in which we are envisioning our future. The guiding question being; Who is our neighbour?




