

## Western Undergraduate Exchange (WUE) Information for Students

#### What is WUE?

WUE is the Western Undergraduate Exchange, a program of the Western Interstate Commission for Higher Education (WICHE). Through WUE, students in a western states and commonwealth may enroll in participating four-year college programs at a reduced fee level. Cal State East Bay is a WUE member institution and offers fulltime students (with residency in WUE states or commonwealth) a tuition rate at 150% of the regular California resident state university fees.

## Is WUE available to graduate students?

No, only undergraduate students are eligible to participate in WUE. Cal State East Bay also offers the Western Regional Graduate Program (WRGP) tuition for select graduate programs; see the WRGP web page.

## Can a WUE student select any of Cal State East Bay's majors?

Students can select any undergraduate major.

## Do I need to apply to be part of the WUE program?

Yes. To participate, students with residency in a state participating in WUE must submit a WUE Participation Agreement Form (on back) to receive the WUE tuition rate.

How does WUE participation impact my ability to become a California Resident? WUE students are not eligible for California resident tuition. Students cannot apply time accrued while participating in the WUE program to establish California residency.

## What if I don't want to be a WUE student?

You are not required to participate in the WUE program. If you prefer to pay non-California resident fees, simply do not send in the WUE Participation Agreement Form. If you have already signed up to be part of WUE and now wish to withdraw from the program, contact the Office of Admission at (510) 885-2784 or e-mail <a href="mailto:admissions@csueastbay.edu">admissions@csueastbay.edu</a> and ask to be removed from the WUE program.

# Western Undergraduate Exchange (WUE) Participation Agreement Form

Eligible students who return the WUE Participation Agreement Form prior to the quarterly fee payment deadline will be charged WUE fees. Forms received after this date will have WUE fees posted starting in the following quarter.

- WUE students are not eligible for California resident state university fees. Students cannot apply time accrued while participating in the WUE program to establish California residency.
- Students may receive the WUE tuition rate until completion of a bachelor's degree.
- Students must be enrolled fulltime (12 units or more) while in the WUE program and maintain academic standards required of non-resident students.
