## Post-doctoral Applications - Content and Form of Letter of Intent

Prospective Applicants are required to submit a Letter of Intent that is approximately one (1) page in length, and includes the following information:

- Descriptive title of proposed research
- Name, address, telephone number and email address of the Post-doc
- Type of grant sought, and RFA number
- Indicate disease target
- Indicate cell type (hESC, ASC, CSC or iPS cell)
- Indicate Whether the intended research is Basic or Translational
- Indicate <u>expertise required from potential reviewer</u> To facilitate the review of the application, please identify the areas and types of expertise needed to evaluate the proposal. Please include keywords that identify elements of the research proposal, such as disease focus, technical approaches, research fields and disciplines.

Applicants will not receive feedback on the Letters of Intent submitted. The Letters of Intent also will not be used by the application reviewers or considered in the evaluation of Applications. The sole purpose of the Letters of Intent is to enable the Commission to plan its workload and select the appropriate range and mix of expertise in the members of the Peer Review Committee, and to enable the Peer Review Committee to plan its review workload.
