Tryouts for the Planoettes will be Thursday, January 23rd and Friday, January 24th starting at 5:30 in the PSHS gym. The workshops for the tryouts will be January 17th (cafeteria), January 21st (gym) and January 22rd (cafeteria) from 5:00-6:30pm. The results will be posted on the Planoettes website. Please read all information carefully in the packet before signing the contracts. Eligibility Requirements:

- 1. You must be an enrolled junior or senior student at Plano Senior High for the 2014-2015 school year to attend the workshops and auditions for drill team.
- 2. Vacancies occurring after the tryouts and prior to the beginning of the next school year may be filled, at the discretion of the campus principal and sponsor, until the opening date of school, utilizing the next highest ranked student.

Workshops

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- 1. Only those sophomore & junior students auditioning for drill team will be admitted to the workshops. All practice sessions and both auditions are closed to the public.
- 2. Workshops will begin promptly at 5:00-please be on time!
- 3. Hopefuls must wear a dance top and dance pants/capris during workshops. Jazz shoes must be worn at all times.
- 4. Hair must be in a ponytail... parted over left eye and slicked back no whispies.
- 5. No gum is allowed and jewelry must be removed before the workshops begin.
- 6. Food and drink are not allowed in the gym. Only water bottles will be allowed.

Auditions

- 1. Only those sophomore & junior students auditioning for drill team will be allowed into the gym area, along with Planoette members whom are helping.
- 2. All Hopefuls will have an individual number and a group number assigned to them. Each group will consist of 3-5 dancers. Judges know the Hopefuls only by number-no names are used.
- 3. Auditions will begin promptly at 5:30 pm on Thursday and Friday.
- 4. Hopefuls should wear appropriate drill team make-up.
- 5. The only jewelry allowed is rhinestone earring studs and hair must be in a slicked bun parted over the left eye.
- 6. Hopefuls must wear the following items for auditions:
 - Black turtle neck long-sleeved leotard
 - Black jazz pants (long)
 - Black socks
 - Black jazz shoes

Judging Criteria:

1. All Hopefuls will be judged on the following categories as stated in the PISD Guidelines for Senior High Drill Team Tryouts. For details on these categories, please see the judging category descriptors page in this packet.

•	Jazz Technique	20pts	•	Kick Technique	20pts
•	Jazz Execution	20pts	•	Showmanship	10pts
•	Kick Height	20pts	•	Splits	10pts

- 2. The judges only know each Hopeful by number-NO NAMES WILL BE USED.
- 3. If a Hopeful chooses to audition twice, then the highest total score will be used from that day, it is not an average of the two day's scores.
- 4. Each Hopeful must remain at the audition site until the final group has performed in the event that callbacks are necessary.
- 5. The maximum number of team members allowed for a varsity team is 75. The maximum number of team members may be exceeded in the event that there is a tie for the final position. In the event that there is a tie all Hopefuls involved in the tie will be allowed on the team.
- 6. The senior high team may exceed 75 members in years that there are more than 40 juniors exempted from auditions. Example if 43 juniors are exempted from auditions, up to 3 additional students may be allowed on the team.
- 7. You MUST receive a minimum average score of 70 to become a drill team member. Those girls receiving an average score of 70 or above will be members, provided that number does not exceed 75. However, if the number of girls receiving an average score of 70 or above does exceed 75, then the 75 girls with the highest scores will become drill team members.

8. No results will be posted after the first audition. Results will be posted Friday, January 24th on the Planoettes website. They will be posted at a particular time given by the director. Only **NUMBERS** will be posted.

Physicals:

ALL HOPEFULS <u>will be required</u> to go through a routine physical prior to the start of tryout workshops, January 17th. This is a requirement to take all appropriate steps to ensure the girls' safety at all times. The UIL physical forms can be found attached in this packet.

Planoette Official Website:

The Year in Review

Team Fitting:

March 18th at 5:30pm will be team fitting for new Planoettes. Team wear will cost approximately \$665 plus personal items such as tights, sports bras, shoes, etc. Payment plans may be set up. All team wear has to be paid prior to line camp in order to participate.

Summer Camp:

All members must attend summer camp. Camp is a time for the girls not only to get to know one another, but a time to develop skills needed throughout the year. The dates for summer camp are July 31^{st} – August 3^{rd} at the Hilton DFW Lakes. The camp clothes pick up will be Tuesday, July 29^{th} , at 11:30am in the PSHS cafeteria. Payment for this camp will cost approx. \$425, is due by **May 16**th to Planoette Bootbackers.

Boot Camp:

Boot camp is held shortly before school begins, from 8:00am to 4:00pm. All members must attend the full practice time allotted. During this time, the team will practice all football routines, stand routines, some competition routines and condition for the fall. **New Planoettes**: August $5^{th} - 7^{th}$ from 8am -12pm at PSHS. **All Planoettes**: August $11^{th} - 15^{th}$ from 8am-4pm at Carpenter MS and August $18^{th} - 20^{th}$ from 4:30-7:30pm at PSHS.

Football Season:

Fall is football season and the beginning of our year! The Planoettes will perform at all football games, away and home. **Members will tryout for each football routine.** All members are expected to attend all games with the team. For all games, the team will meet in the dance room and ride a bus to and from the stadium.

Basketball Season:

The Planoettes will perform at select basketball games throughout the season. We will not travel to out of town regular season basketball games.

Competition Season:

Competition is a serious time for the team and a chance for them to grow as a team and as individuals. All members are expected to participate in competition. <u>Members will try-out for all competition routines.</u>

Practices for competition will be held before and after school and on some Saturdays and weekday evenings. The time commitment will depend on the number of routines the member is involved.

PIZZAZZ- Spring Show:

Spring Show is a PSHS drill team production held in the Dr. Dean Performing Arts Center at PSHS. The girls will participate in a number of routines together and with specialty groups within the team. It will be their opportunity to show all they have learned throughout the year.

FUNDRAISERS:

The Planoettes participate in the following fundraisers throughout the year... please be aware that you are asked to participate in each of these. There are two mandatory fundraisers for the team as they are to pay for all spirit items, water and snacks for games and competition.

PLANO INDEPENDENT SCHOOL DISTRICT

Drill Team Operational Guidelines

I. <u>General Information</u>

- A. Drill Team Prep will be offered at the ninth and tenth grade level, and will cover the basic fundamentals used in drill team.
- B. One class period will be designated on each high school and senior high campus for drill team.
- C. Drill team members must be full-time students on their campuses.
- D. High school drill teams may perform at a maximum of five in town football games per season, schedule permitting. High school drill teams will not perform at out-of-town games.
- E. Members may not perform as a group representing the school unless the director or a faculty representative is present.
- F. Hazing, as stated in Plano I.S.D. Board Policy #FNCC, will not be permitted at any time. All events, whether on or off campus (i.e. camps, contests, etc.), are included in this guideline.

II. <u>Transportation/Competition Trips</u>

- A. Transporting of the team must be in accordance with Plano ISD regulations.
- B. High school competitions will be limited to one in state contest per team per year, subject to district overnight travel guidelines.
- C. Senior high school drill teams may participate in two competitions per year provided at least one competition is a local competition, and does not require school absence or overnight accommodations. Senior high school drill teams may travel out of state for one competition, subject to district overnight travel guidelines.

III. Financial/Gifts

A. The school district, through the operating budget, will furnish all field uniforms, props, and accessories used in public performances, with the exception of spring show costs, competition costumes, and personal items such as tights, socks, workout outfits, etc.

- B. Student/parent expenditures for costumes, supplies, and equipment shall not exceed the prescribed dollar amount as set by the district each school year, excluding camp expenses. This amount will be adjusted each school year in accordance with the consumer price index based upon 1995 baseline of \$450. The adjusted amount for 2013-14 is \$665. Boots and/or hats are included in the per student maximum expense. A listing of these items and their costs is to be provided to the building principal each year.
- C. Drill team organizations and/or their parent booster groups may conduct fund raising events consistent with PISD policies and guidelines (excluding door-to-door direct selling), for the purpose of a recognition banquet for members, and to establish a fund to assist drill team members and/or their organizations in the purchase of additional items necessary for special events. Funds are to be deposited into the campus activity account or booster account as per PISD School Board Policy GE (Local).
- D. Treats for athletes will not be permitted.
- E. The exchanging of gifts (big sis/li'l sis, buddy system, etc.) will not be a requirement for participation or membership on the drill team. Such voluntary gifts are subject to an annual \$10 maximum expense per student.
- F. Drill team awards will not exceed the allowable amounts set by the U.I.L. for their activities. Those amounts currently are \$10 per student, per year, for grades 9-11, and \$70 per year for grade 12. Booster clubs may not give gifts to individuals. Booster Clubs may not present gifts exceeding \$500 in value to drill team directors. These amounts are cumulative for the year.
- G. All purchases are to be requested by purchase order. Student payments for individual items are to be deposited into the student activity account.

IV. Routine Performance Requirements

Routines for performance during the regular season shall be designed to utilize all of the drill team members. Tryouts may be held at any time during the week, at the Director's discretion, to determine the student's preparedness level for performance that week. Students may also be disqualified from participation because of failure to meet weekly grade requirements and/or other disciplinary action.

V. <u>Senior High Spring Show Guidelines</u>

A. Running Time

The length of spring shows shall not exceed two hours. This time limit is inclusive of slide shows and intermissions. Senior high spring shows may include a senior award presentation at the conclusion of the final show. This will not be included in the time limitation.

B. Spring Show Participants

Groups and/or individuals apart from the home campus, with the exception of the show's emcee and parents of drill team members, shall not be allowed to perform as a part of the spring show. Senior high shows may include sophomore drill teams in the feeder cluster. If the feeder cluster drill teams are used, all of the high schools in that feeder cluster should be offered the opportunity to participate.

C. Costuming

Students may provide a maximum of two costumes, subject to overall drill team spending limitations as established under Operational Guidelines section III.B. In the event that the costume expense causes the drill team spending limit to be exceeded, the costumes may be provided by booster funds or show proceeds. Costumes paid for by boosters or show proceeds become the property of the campus. Additional costuming needs may be provided through existing costume inventory within the district.

D. Practice Time

Practices must conform to the eight-hour rule as defined in Senate Bill 1. The director may begin rehearsals no earlier than two months prior to the opening date of the show.

E. <u>Production Expense</u>

All expenses and costs of the spring show shall be paid from the proceeds of the show. Supplemental funds may be provided by the parent booster organizations. The drill team director shall present a budget to the principal for approval prior to the beginning of rehearsals. Maximum expense for all spring show expenses, except costuming, shall be calculated by the following formula.

(House capacity) X (ticket price) X (# of performances)

If unusual circumstances arise that create the need for the expense limitation to be exceeded, the Coordinator for drill team activities must give approval.

F. Show Dates

It is recommended that senior high school spring shows run for a maximum of three nights. In cases where seating capacity and fire safety are concerns, an extra day may be added. Senior high spring shows may not exceed four nights. As per UIL/TEA guidelines, performances are limited to one during the school week, which is defined as Monday through the close of school on the last day of the school week. Additional performances may be scheduled after school on the last instructional day of the week and on Saturday. Sunday rehearsals/performances are prohibited except in extenuating circumstances as per PISD administrative guidelines.

PLANO INDEPENDENT SCHOOL DISTRICT

Drill Team Tryout Guidelines

I. <u>Purpose</u>

A. <u>Drill Team High School:</u>

The 9th - 10th grade drill team program is designed to provide an introductory experience in drill team that encourages participation by interested students. Students will have the opportunity to participate in public performances and/or competition at an intermediate level. In addition to the development of drill team dance skills, the high school drill team shall promote school spirit, good sportsmanship, encourage teamwork, develop leadership skills, and support the mission of the high school campus. The high school drill team also serves to develop skills to prepare students for participation in drill team at the senior high school level.

B. <u>Drill Team Senior High School:</u>

The 11th – 12th grade senior high school drill team program serves to continue those drill team skills taught at the 9th -10th grades high school, but at an advanced level for public performance and/or competition. The senior high school drill team shall promote school spirit, good sportsmanship, encourage teamwork, develop leadership skills, and support the mission of the senior high school campus.

II. <u>Tryout Requirements</u>

A. Residency/Enrollment:

Students must be enrolled in a Plano ISD school at the time of the packet deadline. In addition, they must be in attendance at the tryout school, one of its feeders, or have an approved transfer on file in the central administration building at the time of the tryouts. If the currently enrolled PISD student is relocating to an area within the Plano ISD, but within another feeder pattern, the student must present proof of residency certification, provided by the Plano ISD Student Services Department, at the time of the packet deadline.

B. Eligibility:

All eligibility requirements will meet the criteria subject to state law and/or rules interpretation by the State Board of Education. As per TEA/UIL guidelines, a student who is academically ineligible may attend all practices and tryouts, as actual participation does not occur until the following year.

C. Procedures for Auditions:

- 1. Students may try out at only one campus per year.
- 2. Students desiring to tryout will pick up an information packet and sign up at their HOME school. The packets and sign-up forms will be available in the principal's, or designee's, office.

- Each student will be certified as to eligibility for tryouts by the HOME school principal, or designee. Eligibility will consist of
 meeting:
 - residency and enrollment requirements
 - other items listed in these guidelines
- 5. The HOME school will provide the host school a list designating those students who are eligible.

D. Selection Process

1. There will be two auditions conducted to select each drill team. The auditions will consist of three practice days and two audition days. Students will be allowed to participate in both auditions; however, it will not be mandatory. The highest total score obtained at a single audition will be the score used to determine ranking. As we have two auditions and use only one score, there will be no special scheduling of positions during try-outs to accommodate personal conflicts. UIL competitions and school-sanctioned activities are an exception. Call Backs may be allowed on day two of tryouts.

- 2. A panel of four judges from outside the Plano I.S.D will be secured by the Building Principal, or designee, from the resources supplied by the Coordinator of Drill Team Activities. Judges must not have taught, or be related to, any student trying out. At least three judges must be present for the auditions to be conducted. Judges will use the approved Plano I.S.D. judging sheet, and will rank candidates by total score. In the event there are only three judges present at either audition, the candidate's lowest score on the audition with four judges will be dropped. Judges' sheets will be initialed by the individual judge and retained on file in the principal's office until the opening day of the following school year.
- 3. Parents may review individual scores of their students by contacting the principal, or designee. Requests to view scores must be made within 10 school days from the last day of tryouts. Individual scores of other students may not be viewed.
- 4. All names of candidates will be assembled in one pool and random drawing will be used to determine tryout positions, with some accommodation for height.
- 5. Judges will not confer during tryouts. Each judge is expected to give his/her fair and honest evaluation of each candidate based upon the criteria and points on the judging sheet. (Judges will be seated at separate locations.)
- 6. At the discretion of the building principal, an average score of 70 may be utilized as the minimum score for placement of students on the drill team. Regardless of score, the maximum allowable drill team members shall remain in effect as per Membership requirements, section III.A.
- 7. In the event of a tie for the final position on the drill team, all students involved in the tie will be allowed on the team.
- 8. A committee of one building administrator from each high school and senior high school, Executive Director of Campus Services, Director of Fine Arts and Special Academic Services, and Coordinator for drill team activities will be formed to obtain consistency for the drill team program throughout the district.
- E. The method for selection of drill team officers will be left to the discretion of the campus principal and sponsor. Criteria for selection may include additional criteria beyond those physical skills listed for the regular line tryout.
- F. The method for selecting auxiliary personnel (Maroon Guard, Golden Escorts, etc.) will be left to the discretion of each campus sponsor and principal.
- G. **RESULTS OF TRYOUTS** Tryout results may not be appealed beyond the campus level.

III. Membership Requirements

A. The maximum number per team will be:

High School - $55^{1,2}$ Senior High School - $75^{1,3}$

¹ The maximum number may be exceeded at either the high school or senior high school in the event of a tie for the final position on the drill team, in which case all students involved in the tie will be allowed on the team.

²The high school team will allocate the first 30 positions to the 30 highest scoring incoming 10th graders, with scores ranked above the minimum score of 70. The remaining positions will be filled at large from incoming 9th or 10th graders with scores of 70 or higher until the maximum number for the team is achieved.

³ The senior high school team may exceed 75 members in years when more than 40 juniors are exempted from auditions. Example: If 43 juniors are exempted from auditions, up to 3 additional students may be allowed.

Vacancies occurring after the tryouts and prior to the beginning of the next school year may be filled, at the discretion of the campus principal and sponsor, until the opening day of school, utilizing the next highest ranked student.

- B. All current junior line members on senior high teams will be exempt from tryouts for the senior year with the exception of juniors on probation.
- C. <u>Grades</u>: All academic eligibility requirements will meet the criteria subject to state laws and/or rules interpretation by the State Board of Education.
- D. Other rules (Constitution, by-laws, Demerit System, etc.) may be instituted by the individual campuses, but must be in keeping with the content and intent of these guidelines and other policies of the school district. They shall be approved and initialed by the principal <u>before</u> being distributed to the students and/or parents.
- E. All students and parents will receive a copy of these guidelines <u>prior</u> to drill team tryouts. Parents will sign these guidelines and return them to the building principal prior to tryouts.
- F. <u>Physicals</u> will be required upon entering the first and third year of high school. In the second and fourth years an updated medical history form will be completed by the parent and student. As long as there have been no changes in their medical history a new physical will not be required.* See form.

*For new members to the squad a physical will have to be completed and given to the sponsor before any participation and/or workout.

G. After tryouts, the student is considered part of the new school year drill team, therefore, infractions that occur after tryouts then become part of the new school year. Drill Team members may be placed on probation, removed temporarily, or removed permanently.

Guidelines for District Extracurricular Activities

Students involved in extracurricular activities are held to a higher standard of conduct than the general student body. Plano ISD views participation in extracurricular activities as a privilege, not a right. Any student who violates the Student Code of Conduct shall be subject to extracurricular discipline and/or regular school district disciplinary action. This includes any misconduct, regardless of time or location, that would reflect negatively upon Plano ISD in an extracurricular activity. Students clearly involved in major disciplinary infractions (i.e. including, but not limited to, drugs, alcohol, and violent behavior) will be placed on probation, removed temporarily, or removed permanently from extracurricular activities. Seasons of extracurricular activities may vary and could extend into the next school year. Discipline action may affect tryout eligibility for the next season.

Disciplinary measures taken by the sponsor/principal may be in one or more of three forms, defined as special assignments, probation, and dismissal.

Special assignments may consist of extra duties and may be assigned for minor disciplinary infractions.

Probation and/or dismissal from extracurricular activities will be for infractions involving alcohol, smoking, drugs, use of profanity, violence, and other serious offenses when the sponsor/principal believes the integrity and credibility of the organization has been jeopardized by the student's action. Probation may also be assigned when the student fails to comply with rules and regulations of the extracurricular activity. (Probation is defined as: A trial period in which a student is permitted to redeem bad conduct.)

The student may be dismissed from the extracurricular activity upon any major infraction, or during a probationary period. Prior to being dismissed from extracurricular activities, the student and parents will be notified of the reasons for the action. The student or his/her parents will be afforded the opportunity of a hearing with the sponsor and principal. The appeals process will be outlined at that time. Request for an appeal must be done within 5 school days at each level of the appeals process. The student will not be eligible for any individual or team recognitions or awards that occur after the date of dismissal.

- ✓ Planoettes requires a large time commitment and it is important that you understand the requirements before you decide to join the team. Please review the attached calendar carefully and discuss it with your family.
- ✓ During the school year, we will practice every day from about 7:30am-1st period. During football season we will have Thursday afternoon practice for rehearsal with the band. You should anticipate practicing on some evening and Saturdays in the spring for contest and spring show but you will get plenty of notice about these practices.
- ✓ Football games are usually held on Friday nights.
 (SOMETIMES they are on Thursday's or Saturday's as well).
- ✓ During basketball season, the team performs at select home basketball games. However, it depends each year. Basketball games are on Tuesday or Friday nights.

- ✓ Planoette activities will be held to a minimum on the weekends. You should expect one a month.

PLANOETTE CONSTITUTION

ARTICLE I NAME

★★

The name of this organization shall be called "Planoettes".

ARTICLE II PURPOSE

The Planoettes will function as a support organization representing Plano Senior High School. Their purpose along with representing Plano Senior High at all times shall be to provide halftime entertainment at all Wildcat varsity football games, varsity basketball games, perform in PSHS pep rallies, participate in drill team contest, present Pizzazz (annual spring show), and participate or perform at any other functions involving Plano Senior High that the Director and administrators shall see as advantageous to Plano Senior High and the Planoette organization.

ARTICLE III PLANOETTE CODE OF ETHICS

"As a Planoette I will always conduct myself in a ladylike manner and I will maintain the highest moral standard at all times. I will not engage in any behavior that discredits or jeopardizes the integrity and moral standards of the team. I will always take pride in myself and the Planoette organization."

ARTICLE IV PLANOETTE LINE AUDITIONS

- A. Auditions for Planoettes will be held during the second semester of the school year. The audition dates will be set by the Planoette Director and the Associate Principal of Plano Senior High.
- B. Any girl who is currently enrolled in Plano Senior High, or at Plano Senior High feeder school and is currently a Sophomore or Junior is eligible to audition for Planoettes.

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ARTICLE V PLANOETTE LINE MEMBER REQUIREMENTS

CONDUCT

- A. Members are expected to uphold a high standard of behavior that is necessary for the integrity and reputation of the organization. Members should be leaders in the school and should set a good example at all times. Members are expected to have and maintain a character above reproach.
- B. Proper manners should be used at all times to address adults and Officers. Mutual respect and politeness toward fellow members within the group are basic elements that contribute to the total success of the team.
- C. The following are expressly forbidden: assault or harassment of Director or team members, theft of team or individual property.
- D. The use of alcohol, tobacco, and illegal drugs are expressly forbidden and will not be tolerated.

E. No visible tattoos or body piercings will be allowed during any drill team function/activity. Failure to abide by this policy will result in point deductions.

GRADES

A. A member must meet all grade requirements as outlined by the State Board of Education, Texas Education Agency, UIL and state law.

- B. Any member receiving a grade lower than a 70 during a six week period will be ineligible and will be placed on probation. The candidate must participate in practice, but may not perform with the team or attend performance functions with the team.
- C. Any candidate who is placed on grade probation will become an alternate for any routine that she has been placed in. Once the member regains her eligibility she may re-audition for the routine but not guaranteed the same spot.
- D. As a junior Planoette, if you fail once during that year, you must re-audition to be on the team your senior year.
- E. At the time a Planoette fails for a second six weeks within a one year period, there will be a Director, Principal and Parent review.

UNIFORMS AND APPEARANCE

- A. Plano ISD will provide each drill team member with a school issued performance uniform.
- B. The uniform is to be worn to official functions only. The uniform must not be worn to public places unless to a specified performance or with prior approval from the Director(s).
- C. Uniforms must be kept clean at all times. They should be neatly pressed and not in need of mending.
- D. Proper performance make-up will be worn for all performances.
- E. Nail polish or any type of jewelry will not be permitted while in uniform.
- F. Absolutely no gum chewing or candy will be permitted while in uniform.
- G. At the end of the school year for seniors and non-returning members, all school issued uniforms must be laundered and returned on a hanger in laundered plastic bag. Parents are financially responsible for any damages to school issued uniforms and equipment.

PERFORMANCE AUDITIONS

- A. It is possible to be chosen as a Planoette and not perform at every football game, basketball game, competition, or in every dance in Pizzazz (annual Spring Show).
 - a. There will be auditions for each performance. The Director will judge routines. Factors such as attitude, manners, and effort will be taken into consideration as well as ability. Students unable to execute the routine to the expected standard or who have exhibited excessive negativity regarding practices will not be chosen to perform.

- b. If you are cut from a performance you ARE required to attend all practices for that performance as well as attend the performance in uniform.
- c. If a member has a question as to why she did not make a dance, she may conference with the Director(s) during a planned conference period. All the final decisions will be left up to the discretion of the Director(s).
- B. In keeping with the PISD drill team guidelines the following applies: "at least five games during the regular season (homecoming included) will be designed so that all drill team members can participate." The word "designed" means all the routines are choreographed for all members.
- C. Should the Planoettes attend competition, members would be required to audition for their spots in competition groups.
- D. If a member misses auditions for any reason including illness, she will not be permitted to perform that week.

PERFORMANCES

- A. Everything needed for performances will be carried in the drill team bag.
- B. Members who are wearing unacceptable, incomplete performance attire will not be allowed to perform.

- C. During football and basketball games, talking is allowed in the stands, but turning around in the stands will not be permitted.
- D. The use of cell phones or any other electronic devices is strictly prohibited in the stands. They will be taken up and demerits assessed.
- E. All Officers will lead their squad into the stands or performance area in an appropriate manner designated by the Director(s).
- F. Officers and Sergeants will sit in front of their stand lines during both football and basketball games and will maintain proper behavior for her stand line.
- G. Members must use the restroom before leaving the school for a performance. Members will be allowed to use the restroom during the 3rd quarter only. Emergencies must be approved by the Director.
- H. During a football game members must keep lines straight with bags and poms lined up as directed by the Director(s).
- I. Members should pay attention to the game and Planoette Captain at all times.
- J. Talking to visitors during the game will constitute points for talking outside of rank.
- K. Visitors will not be permitted to talk to members unless approved by the Director(s). The 3rd quarter has been designated for families to come down and take a quick picture and hold a quick conversation.

ATTENDANCE

- A. All performances are mandatory.
- B. All after school practices are mandatory.
- C. An absence is recorded if more than 20 minutes late.
- D. You are encouraged to attend tutorials during zero hour, lunch, or after practice. Should you need to attend tutorials during practice, you must secure the Director's permission one day in advance. If you fail to get 1 day in advance notice you will not be excused to attend.
- E. An unexcused absence from drill team class periods and other practices receives a 10-point deduction. (excused absences: personal illness (with doctor's note), death in family, funeral, and religious holiday)
- F. Absence from practice may result in student being benched from the performance that week even if excused, if the Director determines that the student's absence has hindered the ability of the team to practice efficiently or ability of its members to learn the routine.
- G. If you are ill and will miss a practice, or if you check out of school due to illness, your parent/guardian must call PSHS and leave a message for the Planoette Director at 469-752-9511 or email her prior to practice. Failure to do so will result in demerits (see demerit sheet).
- H. Outside employment is not an excuse to miss any part of drill team activities. Doing so constitutes an unexcused absence and results in point deductions.
- I. Students who are absent from school on a performance day are ineligible to perform.
- J. Members are expected to travel TO and FROM all drill team events with the team.
- K. Members are expected to be in attendance for the entire event except in case of an emergency.
- L. After being chosen as a Planoette you are REQUIRED to participate in camp and August practice. If you do not attend camp you will not perform in the first football game. Camp is an important building block for a successful year.

ARTICLE VI DEMERIT SYSTEM

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The Planoettes are expected to follow all the rules set forth by the constitution and its bylaws. The following demerit system will be used to determine performance eligibility and exemption status for current Junior line members at the time of auditions for the following years squad.

- A. Once a drill team member has received 5 demerits she will be benched for the next performance or performance of Director's choice. Each additional 5 demerits will result in a benching.
- B. If a junior member accumulates 10 demerits in the first semester she will be required to audition for her senior year on Planoettes.
- C. If a member accumulates 5 demerits from the beginning of the second semester to the deadline date of the tryout application she will be required to audition for her senior year as well.
- D. Should a member receive 15 demerits in one semester she will be placed on probation for six weeks after a review with the Director, Principal and Parent.
- E. The accumulation of 20 demerits may result in immediate removal even if no benchings or probationary periods have occurred after a review with the Director, Principal and Parent.
- F. All Planoettes begin each six weeks with a 100 in the grade book. For each demerit received, 2 points will be deducted from the weekly participation grade.
- G. Accumulation of two or more benchings may result in a Principal/Director/Parent review.

If a student is academically ineligible at the time of a benching or disciplinary probation, the penalty will be served simultaneously. All extra-curricular activities must follow due-process before any probation, temporary removal or permanent dismissal can occur.

PROBATION AND SUSPENSION

- A. A member must meet all grade requirements as outlined by the State Board of Education, Texas Education Agency, UIL, and state law.
- B. Any member who is placed on probation will not be allowed to participate in any drill team performances during the probation, but must still fully participate in class and after-school practices though the member may not participate in a public performance.
- C. Upon receiving a grade lower than a 70 in any class during a six week period, a member will become ineligible to participate in any drill team activity (excluding practice) until the next eligibility period as set forth by the district and state/UIL guidelines.
- D. A member will be benched for an unexcused absence to class, practice, or a game. The benching will affect any performances within one full week of the unexcused absence. If no performances are scheduled within that week, the member will be benched for the next schedule performance.
- E. If a member is placed on probation, that member will also be on probation regarding Specialty Groups and may not audition for or perform with such groups.
- F. During any probation period, a member may not wear anything with Planoettes on it, this includes game days and pep rallies.
- G. 15 demerits equal possible probation with a review with the Director, Activities Principal and Parent.
- H. 20 demerits equal possible dismissal from the team with a review with Director, Activities Principal, and Parent.
- The following situations are also grounds for possible probation and/or dismissal from the team with a review with the Director, Activities Principal, and Parent.

The Director(s) shall have the authority to give demerits for offenses when necessary which have not been included or which have been inadvertently excluded. The number of demerits given will directly reflect the severity of the offense.

MERITS

- A. Planoettes members have the opportunity to earn merits to erase demerits, but any benching will be served if demerits are reached PRIOR to merits being earned.
- B. It is the individual's responsibility to ask the director how she may earn merits.
- C. Merits will NOT impact the student's six week grade.

ARTICLE VII PLANOETTE OFFICER/SERGEANT AUDITIONS

All Officers/Sergeants are expected to maintain the highest standards. They are not only members of the team; they are top representatives of the organization. They must be on their best behavior at all times. They are expected to set excellent examples in and out of school for all line members and other PSHS students. Should any Officer/Sergeant fail to follow the guidelines set forth by the constitution and its bylaws or should any Officer/Sergeant fall short of her duties she will be subject to removal of rank and/or dismissal from the team.

PLANOETTE OFFICER/SERGEANT CANDIDATE ELIGIBILITY

- A. A candidate for Captain, Lt. Captain, 1st Lieutenant, Sr. Lieutenant, 1st Sergeant, and Sr. Sergeant must have been a member of the Planoettes drill team the year in which they are auditioning. The candidate has maintained positive relationships with teachers and teammates.
- B. A candidate for Junior Lieutenant and/or Junior Sergeant has maintained positive relationships with teachers, fellow students and is open to all 2013-2014 team members for the next school year. A minimum of 1 Junior Lieutenant will be chosen to the officer line each year.

PLANOETTE OFFICER/SERGEANT AUDITION PROCESS

- A. The Officers/Sergeants will be chosen on a designated date set by the Director. Four to five qualified judges will preside over the audition.
- B. The following components will factor into the judges process:
 - 1. original solo routine
 - 2. jazz/lyrical routine
 - 3. kicks & splits

- 4. Officer strut/Kick Routine
- 5. image/presence
- 6. judges interview
- C. The following components will factor into the Directors score:
 - 1. adaptive
 - 2. teaching evaluation
 - 3. power point presentation

- 4. notebook evaluation
- 5. Director's interview
- 6. team vote
- D. All items will be totaled to give each candidate a final score.
- E. It is at the Directors' discretion to determine ranks and numbers for any Officer/Sergeant positions.

PLANOETTE OFFICER DUTIES

- A. All Officers are under the direction of the Director(s). Officers are selected to assist the Director(s) in leading the drill team.
- B. Officers are required to attend all practices, meetings, fund-raisers, and performances.
- C. Officers will show respect to the team, Director(s), and school staff at all times.
- D. Officers will have a positive attitude while promoting school spirit and team unity.
- E. Officers are to cooperate with each other and be open to everyone's ideas.
- F. Officers are held to higher standards than line members and will abide by all the guidelines set forth in the Planoette Constitution.
- G. Officers are expected to assume leadership responsibilities and maintain discipline in the line.
- H. Officers will always arrive at least 10 minutes early to practice, meetings, and performances.
- I. Officers will choreograph routines as designated by the Director.
- J. Officers will be required to buy additional clothing and costumes.
- K. Being an Officer is a privilege and not following all guidelines could result in removal of Officer rank.

PLANOETTE SERGEANT DUTIES

- A. assuming Officer responsibility when the Officers are absent
- B. performing in all performances
- C. running and preparing for the Planoette clinic alongside the Officers
- D. running junior boot camp week
- E. choreographing and cleaning junior jazz for spring show
- F. any other duties or responsibilities the Director assigns to them

ARTICLE IX MAROON GUARDS

A. It is at the Directors' discretion to determine ranks and numbers for any Maroon Guard position.

- B. The Maroon Guards will be in charge of handling heavy equipment and they will provide an escort for the Planoettes as they are entering or exiting the stands, field, in route to the bus, during parades, or any other time the Director feels escorts are necessary.
- C. The Maroon Guards will also help with the preparation, building or assembly of props.
- D. They may also be assigned other duties by the Director such as distributing water to the Planoettes after performances, videotaping, running the PSHS flag, etc.
- E. The Maroon Guards are required to register for the Planoettes class period. They are required to attend all Planoette practices and performances.
- F. The Maroon Guards will be required to follow their own set of guidelines.
 - 1. They are to set an outstanding example for fellow PSHS students to follow.
 - 2. The extra-curricular code of conduct applies to the maroon guards as well as the district's policy on extra-curricular activities.

ARTICLE X PLANOETTE MANAGER(S)

Each year the Director will determine the need of a manager(s). The Planoettes' needs vary from year to year; therefore, the Director may chose not to have any managers or she may choose as many as she feels are necessary to help the following years program run smoothly.


In the event that a manager(s) is chosen she will be expected to follow all the rules set forth by the constitution and by-laws. The Director will require specific duties of the manager and the managers will be required to follow the extra-curricular code of conduct as well as the district's policy on extra-curricular activities.

ARTICLE XI PLANOETTE DIRECTOR AVAILABILITY

In order to respect the privacy and family time of the Planoette Director the following will apply:

- A. The Planoette Director is available for conferences to address concerns of parents or Planoettes/Maroon Guard, Monday-Friday during her assigned conference time.
- B. If the above time is not convenient you may leave a message 24 hours a day by calling the Directors voice mail at 469-752-9511. The Planoette Director will return your call later in the day, during school hours, or the following school day. The Director will be glad to work with any parent/student to schedule a convenient meeting time should the parent/student be unavailable during the Director's conference time.
- C. If a concern arises during the summer months or during school holidays, parents may contact the Planoette Bootbacker President, email the director, or leave a message on the Directors voice mail (number above). The Planoette Director will return the call as soon as possible; however accessibility of the Director during summer months and school holidays will be limited.
- D. If a Planoette/Maroon Guard has a concern after school or practice hours she/he should contact his/her squad Officer.
- E. Parents should never contact a Planoette Officer regarding a concern. Parents must contact the Director or the Bootbacker President.
- F. The Planoette Director should never be contacted at home except in case of an extreme emergency.


