A discussion was started on how the rotation for the areas taking the National Office positions worked. James Ford informed that there is no rotation used. If more than one area applies at the same time, then the National Board makes the decision on which one will hold the National Office. The longest amount of time since an area has held the National Office is used as priority.

The APDA by-laws give a 2 year term for the National Office. A discussion was brought up on whether to extend this to a 3, 4 or 5 year term. This was tabled until the National Business meeting.

This would be all be good information for the Area Trustees to take back to their respective areas in how the National office usually moves around.

Report of Committees

Michele Wynne, log editor, reported that she has been going to each area's meetings and taking pictures. The 2009 version of the log will include a collage of each one of the areas.

It will also possibly include a survey about what each company does (do have they have mapboards, what kinds, etc.) Possibly have a write-up on what companies are doing for a broad situational awareness & also pondering a short history of some of the companies that published histories. If being a host utility, possibly getting their history posted.

James Ford brought up that we have gotten away from using the log as a training tool whether its tools from our business or interesting slides from presenters, instead of strictly using the log for posting minutes.

Danny Bucklen has historical pictures that have been gathered (vintage phone equipment, relays, etc.) that can be used if needed and requested to be able to regroup the members by area instead of only listing the members alphabetically.

Michele Wynne has the information in a spreadsheet and will be able to sort the members by a column for the area, a column for the company & a column for the last name. Also, has found a program that allows to enter words and descriptions and it will put together a crossword puzzle that may be used in the log.

No one is present for the National scholarship committee. The National scholarship application on the website needs to reflect the changes made due to the addition of a second scholarship from the previous meeting. Adding the second scholarship was voted on and approved at the last meeting. This will be carried on to the National business meeting.

Unfinished Business

Michele Wynne reported that one box has arrived from the archival material and unfortunately, very little of it was duplicate. There were duplicates from a by-laws change in 1997. There were duplicates of applications for membership and one folder is in hand for anyone to see that wants to see it that has meeting minutes, newsletters, correspondence & scholarship applications. The newsletters that were found were the "SE Connection", "Flashback", "APDA Life Members", "SW Wire" & one "Mid-Atlantic Dialogue" from 1995.

Danny Bucklen informed that this falls under the category of sentimental value and we could look into sorting the information into their respective area and give the respective area back their records to let them decide whether to keep or discard the material.

James Ford informed that the "Flashback" was the only National newsletter.

<u>Unfinished Business (cont.'d)</u>

Michele Wynne, temporary National Historian, will contact the Area Trustees and let them know what's in the box for their respective area and will let them take it to their area and decide whether they already have the material. If it is not needed or wanted, then the proper steps will be taken to discard the material.

The Outstanding Service Award for Kevin Conway has not been received and Doug Kruspe did not receive or request the award.

Danny Bucklen had given the Oustanding Service Award to someone in the Las Vegas, NV, NW/SW meeting that was expected to cross paths with him in the near future. Danny will try to find the responsible party for delivering the award and will make sure that the Outstanding Service Award will ultimately go to its destination of Kevin Conway.

New Business

Some discussion was brought up about possible compensation for the National Officers due to long distance travel within an area. James Ford informed plans have been added in the past for travel reimbursement for the National Ambassadors when the meeting is outside of their area or for promotional reasons, added the Log Editor & added the Scholarship chairman.

James suggested financially it might all be able to be handled, but might want to get together a recommendation for a plan for reimbursement for National Officer travel expenses within their area and/or reimbursements overall and bring back a formal plan before the body to vote on so it can be included in the minutes.

Dave Hathaway brought up the following from older days of working in nuclear: An organization called "PROS" (Professional Reactor Operators Society) had a National Board that were active in trying to help direct National policy on operator training, so they were very much involved with the NRC and went out and met with the NRC on many occasions. The question brought to the board is whether it is the right place for the National APDA to be actively working with NERC on how training is derived for operator certification. Should this be taken to NERC or to the FERC level?

James Ford was at Arlington, VA, working with NERC when the certification program was starting in 1996. In terms of the APDA, people have submitted standard changes and have been involved in the item writing workshops. These item writing workshops involved getting two members from each area to make sure the questions reflected what operators did and ended up getting mixed results.

Michele Wynne informed that James came to the meetings and explained to operators that it was coming and that they needed to participate or they would get what engineers and lawyers would write on the test. James pushed the envelope to use the APDA operators to participate. There was so much resistance from the operators on the direction that NERC & SERC were taking that they did not want to participate in the new programs that were being talked about.

New Business (cont.'d)

Danny Bucklen informed that a process was started all the way back to the beginning of operator testing, and the APDA might not always be there, but it is the APDA intent to be visible and be credible.

Karen Mims brought a question to the table that due to the information coming from the other areas in struggling to pay for CEH's, would it be appropriate to look into raising the reimbursement for CEH's? Currently, for each area meeting, National will pay \$500 for the meeting and \$500 for CEH's.

After some discussion, David Hathaway made a motion to recommend that we raise the National funding for CEH's presented at each area meeting to \$1000, thereby increasing the total reimbursement from \$1000.00 (\$500.00 for meeting expenses & \$500.00 for CEH's) to \$1500.00 (\$500 for meeting expenses & \$1000.00 for CEH's) per meeting. Michele Wynne seconded and the motion carried with an amendment to start in the Fall 2009 area meetings.

Place and Date of Next Meeting

The next National APDA Board of Trustees meeting will be held in Chattanooga, Tennessee in the Fall of 2009. The exact dates and place will be refined and posted on the website as soon as possible.
