Directions to Rentschler Field—The Club

<u>From the North :</u> Take I-91 South to Hartford to I-84 EAST (Exit 32 - Left Exit). Follow I-84 East to Exit 58, ROBERTS STREET/SILVER LANE. On the Exit Ramp, Turn right at the stoplight and then get in the center or left lanes. Turn left on SIL-VER LANE. Go about ¼ of a mile and RENTSCHLER FIELD EAST GATE will be on your right. Once on property, turn right at the stop sign. Proceed around the stadium and enter the Suites and Club Entrance adjacent to Gate A.

<u>From the South:</u> Take I-91 North toward Hartford to Route 15 North/to I-84 East/Charter Oak Bridge (Exit 29). Merge left onto Route 15. After the bridge, take Exit 91 SILVER LANE. Turn right at end of ramp onto Silver Lane. Follow Silver Lane past the Entrance to Pratt & Whitney.
