About the Program

This program will focus on the legal aspects of vehicle fire investigations. A review of Connecticut case law pertaining to vehicle search and seizure, and the methods used to properly determine origin and cause of vehicle fires will be presented, all of which will allow the experienced Investigator to render a reliable opinion. The program will consist of classroom lecture/presentation, class discussions and live vehicle burns.

Enrollment will be limited to 30 individuals and there is a \$175.00 nonrefundable registration fee. Lunch and breaks will be provided. Attendance at all three sessions is mandatory. Tuition reimbursement may be available through the Connecticut FAIR Plan.

All completed applications must be submitted to this office no later than 1600 hours on **September 6, 2013.** Please

do not call the Office of Education & Data Management or the Connecticut State Police Fire & Explosion Investigation Unit. No telephone requests will be honored.

Do not send registration fee with the application.

After review by the selection committee, the candidates selected to attend will be notified by mail and will then submit a completed registration form along with the \$175.00 registration fee.

Preference may be given to graduates of the Annual Advanced Fire Investigation School provided by this Agency or its equivalent.

20 hours of continuing education credit will be awarded.

Program Instructors
