- Provide ACCLAIM-developed mathematics instruction to approximately 25 students daily for 20 halfdays of instruction during summer 2011
- Implement the MAA ACCLAIM-developed standards-based curriculum
- Work collaboratively with MAA staff, including the MAA coordinators, site facilitators, and California State University East Bay MAA mentors
- Utilize MAA benchmark assessments and adjust instruction based on data
- Work collaboratively with district and site administration
- Attend and support the implementation of MAA Parent University Nights and other support programs
- Complete MAA teaching logs, weekly calendar, and daily student attendance
