From "Samuel Combest and His Descendants" book Howard spent his childhood in Kentucky. At the age of nineteen, on 18 December, 1887, he wed Martha Hogan Davenport, age 18 at her parents home in Casey County, the ceremony was performed by Charles Chilton. Martha was the daughter of Newton J. and Matilda "Tildie" Riggins Davenport of Casey County, Kentucky, and was born 22 October, 1869 in Casey County. Two of Howard and Martha's children were born there before they moved to Collin County, Texas and bought a farm

In 1906, Howard M. and Martha H. Davenport Patterson sold their farm in Collin County, Texas and moved to Petrolia, Clay County, Texas, where they rented a farm.

Howard and Martha moved from Casey County Kentucky in 1890 when Walter was three months old to Collin County Texas. (I found Howard Morton Patterson in the 1900 Texas Census living in Collin County in Precinct 3, his occupation was listed as farmer.)

They moved from Collin County to Clay County, Texas in 1906, when Mary was four months old. (I found Howard Morton Patterson listed in the Clay County Texas 1910 Census, his age is listed as 43, the following kids are listed in the household, M. E. (Myrtle Emma), Patrick N., Chauncey D., Alta A., Merrel, Elzy, Marietta (sic), and Curtis. I also found Howard Morton Patterson in the Texas Clay County 1920 census as of March 6th and 8th 1920. His age was listed as 52. Alta, Merrel, Elzy, Mary E., Curtis, and Suzie was listed as living at home.)

Martha died 1920 February 4, and is buried in Riverland Cemetery.

Benjamin was born in 1889 and William in 1890 in Casey County, Kentucky.

In October of 1890 they moved to Collin County, Texas. He bought a farm there and Ethel was born in 1891, Myrtle in 1893, Patrick in 1895, Chauncy in 1897, Alta in 1899, Merrel in 1901, Elzy in 1904 and Mary in 1906. He sold the farm in Collin County in 1906, and moved to the Riverland Community, Clay County, Texas. There Curtis was born in 1908 and Susie in 1910. He rented a farm and was never to own land again in his lifetime. His wife Martha died in 1920. On March 4, 1921, he married Leanore Bell Cornutt Pierce, the widow of Anson Pierce. She was the daughter of David Lee Cornutt and Lou Ellar Wade. She was born in Prospect, Clay County, Texas on October 30, 1899. She had two sons from her first marriage, Herschel and Cecil Pierce. On December 19, 1921 Leanore gave birth to his thirteenth and last child, Lorene.

"Howard was an excellent farmer and hard worker but he drank and was "cranky." He and Leanore could not get along and shortly after the birth of Lorene, they separated. She took her two sons and infant daughter to raise on her own. The girl was never to know her father and Leanore was never to re-marry. She died in Wichita Falls, Texas on May 20, 1975.

Howard never re-married and lived in Petrolia until his death on January 20, 1941.

Riverland Community from a Clay County, Texas old Settler's Reunion Book at the Decatur County Museum in Decatur, Wise County, Texas.

Settlers in the Riverland community began arriving as early as 1870 with the majority who stayed to build the community arriving between 1875 and 1900. By that date all public land had been sold to private owners who improved and used it as they were able. Living conditions were primitive. Dugouts, log or rock cabins, one or two room box houses were commonplace. These conditions, however, did not seem to hinder social activities since parties, dances, picnics and country singings were regular occuences. Postal service, as we know it, was nonexistant, residents receiving their mail at Henrietta. Increase in population brought with a demand for better service, with the result that a post office was established March 5, 1875. Mail for the office was on a tri-weekly basis by star route from Henrietta. Later delivery was by Benvenue star route to Hurnville, from there to Riverland by messenger on a daily basis. This arrangement continued until 1906 when rural route No. One from Henrietta was established which still serves the area.

Spirtual needs of the community were served regularly by ministers of Methodist and Baptist Churches with occasional services by ministers of other communions. Methodist records show a Pastor assigned in 1879 with a continuous succession through 1928. Official Baptist records are not available prior to 1906 but unofficial records place the organization of that congregation as early as 1885. A Baptist church serving German speaking citzens of both Riverland and Hurnville communities was organized prior to 1900, continuing to serve until 1944. A small congregation of Evangelicals also existed briefly early in the century.

Schools were a necessity, the first being subsription schools paid for by families participating. June 23, 1884 Riverland Common School District was created by Clay County Commissioners Court. Election of Trustees came in August of that year. A site was purchased, a building erected and put in use in 1893. Increasing scholastic population made more classroom space necessary but arguments as to how it should be done caused a delay of a few years resulting in the erection of another one room school building in 1909 some three miles from the older one. Both one room teacher schools continued in operation until 1925 when a multi-room building (This is the large room with a divider that Mother attended when she was little. (note by Richard Hollis. All that remains now is the slab and the large cellar) was erected and staffed continuing in operation until consolidation with the Henrietta system.

The only remaining physical evidence of this community is the cemetery, tended by the Riverland Cemetery Association.

### Hi, Mary.

I have "The Handybook for Genealogists" published by Everton Publishers, Inc. It states that Casey Co. KY was formed (1806/07) from Lincoln Co. KY: Lincoln Co. KY was formed in 1780 from Kentucky Co. VA. Nelson Co. KY was formed in 1785 from Jefferson Co. and Jefferson Co. KY was formed in 1780 from Kentucky Co. VA. All of this area was part of VA before the statehood of KY, which Everton's states KY became a state on June 1, 1792. Here is

the first paragraph from the book giving part of the description of the forming of KY:

..."Long before any white man had explored Kentucky, the entire area was claimed by Virginia as part of Augusta County. As early as 1750, Dr. Thomas Walker explored the eastern part of Kentucky. Daniel Boone followed in 1767. The first permanent settlement took place at Harrodsburg in 1774. The next year, Colonel Richard Henderson of North Carolina formed the Transylvania Company. He purchased almost half of Kentucky from Indian tribes, comprising all of the land between the Kentucky River in the central part of the state and the Cumberland River in the extreme western part. Daniel Boone settled Boonesboro in 1775 as well. In 1776, the Kentucky area was taken away from Fincastle County, Virginia and became Kentucky County, Virginia. In 1780, Kentucky County was divided into three counties; Fayette, Jefferson, and Lincoln; which were in turn divided into nine counties within a decade."



"A Daughter's Tribute" by Martha Penn Ikard on 2 March 1967.

In an ordinary home, on the black-land farm, in Colling (sic) County, Texas, on June 8th, seven years before the turn of this century, my Mother became a living soul. She was the fourth child in a family of twelve. When she was 13 years old her parents made a seven day, covered wagon caravan, up state, to Clay County. They settled on tall grass land. They were share-croppers. The school was three miles from home. She walked, if the weather permitted, or if the fields required no work. She studied at home. When I was small, I delighted in hearing her spell difficult words to me. Among the words I thought difficult was "bois'darc".

Her Daddy, Howard Morton Patterson, favored his seven sons in preference to his five daughters. The girls were required to work side by side with the outside labors; however, the boys relaxed at the close of the day. The girls hand washed the work clothes, helped with the cooking and cleaning.

She longed for summer. She enjoyed attending the Gospel Meetings. A traveling Evangelish (sic) would hold nightly Services for several days. She became a teen-age Christian.

Their home was frequently visted by John Earnest Penn. His father owned the land her Daddy farmed. She was 18 on 8 June 1911. On 5 July, she became Mrs. John Earnest Penn. They lived in Petrolia, also in Clay County, and a growing oil field town.

On 24 September 1913, they became parents of a daughter, Grace Ila.

In the indigo of the day on 9 June 1916, I made my entrance into the world. My daddy owned a grain thrasher. He promoted a traveling crew in Clay County. This necessitated him being away from home for several days. On that special day, he returned just in time to be with his wife, when their second daughter arrived. No doubt, Daddy desired and was hopeful I would be a boy. Perhaps, he had dreams of a third child-a son! Like many other plans, he didn't have another child. He died, during the flu epidemic, on 28 October 1918. Mother spoke about the daily processions tot he cemetery to bury the flu victims. In order not to see the sad scenes, she kept the bedroom shades pulled. Almost every family in Petrolia struggled under sickness. Little assistance was expected from outsiders. The Doctors medicines were ineffective. Each day was long and sad. Mother decided to start working as a Practical Nurse. She had helped with the children in her own home. She was the Mother of two, who had been sick, at times. Grace had the flu, during the epidemic that took Daddy's life.

Mother built a home, after Daddy died, across the street from her Mother-in-law, Mrs. John Alfred (Lois Adelia Holditch) Penn. When Mother was working, we received Grannie's undivided, depth of love attention. When she wasn't working, we were pleased to be with her.

Our home was next to one of the town's Doctores (sic), Dr. A. C. Cates. He was the Doctor who delivered me in to the world. He tapped on our front door, to get Mother to go on a case with him, regardless of the hour, day or

night. All during the depression of the "30's", more work was voluntary than salaried. I heard Mother say many time that she asked for her first job.... She wore a white uniform, and white shoes. He was extrely (sic) cautious about germs. She would remove her clothes, in the separate was house.

My memories are vivid, when I was five years old, of the daily trips to carry cool water to the carpenters, when they built the first Meeting House for members of the Church of Christ, From the begging of the Congregation, Mother taught Bible Classes. She did more than her "share" of cleaning the building. She baked "unleavened" bread. She washed the communion cups. She washed the soft white linen cloths that covered The Lord's Supper. Her hands eagerly held the hoe handle, when a clean-up day was announced.

The doors never opened for Services, unless providentially hindered, that Mother did not take Grace and me to Worship.

She was fancy cook, and a neat homemaker. Visitors were welcome. Grace and me could invite freiends to come home with us from Services on tThe Lord's Day. From my viewpoint, Mother was the most exacting and mandatory of all the mothers I knew of my friends. In regards to preparing Bible School lessons and reverence in Worship, whe was tough! Many times, when we arrived hom from Services, she requested I outline the sermon, or my bible lesson, on my chalk board. (I use a blck-board when I teach a Bible Class).

Mother insisted Grace and me keep our bedroom clean, our clothes hung in the closet, and persoanl belonings (sic) be well organized. She could find any item in our house, without a light.

I cannot rember a death in our hamlet of 600 population, when she did not assist in some way. When Grannie Penn became unalbe to properly caref for herself, Mother locked our homee, and we moved in to care for her during the last three monthe of her life. She died 20 July 1925.

I am among the forutnate to have received benefits from a Christian Mother, a a (sic) Christian Grandmother, (Il Timothy 1:5)

On 12 May 1927, Mother married Homer F. Pepper. On 28 May 1929 they became parents of David Edwin Pepper. Homer died on 10 April 1937, with pneumonia.

As I grew older, my thoughts, regardless if they were good or bad, were boldly read by her. Regardless of how hard I tried to keep a secret from her she would find out--I am grateful she stressed Spiritual conscientiousness along with thoughtfulness of personal responsibility. To be punctual was a (sentence not finished)

Like all Mothers, she made her mistakes. None the less, she had one d (word cut off) in life, and that was this: "TRAIN UP A CHILD IN THE WAY HE SHOULD GO" (Proverbs 22:6)

On 11 October 1946 Mother married Charlie N. Ellis. He lived in Burkburnett, Texas, 13 miles from Wichita Falls. Mother sold our home, when she moved to Burkburnett. Mr. Ellis helped to start the Congregation for the Church of Christ in Burkburnett. He was an active member of the Church of Christ in Petrolia, when his wife lived. He worked for the Magnolia Oil Company. He died with a heart condition on 18 July 1954. She lives alone. Mother has buried three husbands, yet, she has spent more of her adult life, with a husband.

Mother eagerly looked forward to her first Social Security Check. The Elders for the Burkburnett Church of Christ were in a building program, when she got her first check, she put enought with it to make a \$50.00 donation. As long as I can remember, even though her income was limited, she donated to Christian education. When she attended her Grandson's graduation from Abilene Christian College in, Abilene, Texas, with his B.S. in Education in August (year cutoff of copy) one of her life-long dreams cmae true. She didn't get to attend his graducation from the same College, with his Master's Degree in School Adminstration (sic) in August 1960. Grace had four children, none of them attended a Church of Christ College. She was pleased Ed and me made plans, when Eddie Penn was a baby to send him to Abile (sic) Christian College. There are many reasons why we are happy we carried out our plans for him to receive a Christian Education, and one (word cutoff) because he met and married Patsy Lou "Patti" Foster, on 24 June 1961. They have two sons, Shane--born 14 November 1962 and Shannon--born 16 January (word cutoff).

Mother will soon be 74. Her heath is good. She still helps the sick, writes letters, sends cards, visits the shut=ins, and delivers home-cooked food to many persons. Getting ready for her family to come home to visit is a great joy for her.

Mother has completed several correspondence Bible Courses. In between crochet stiches, she watches Television.

Eternity alone will reveal the good from this dedicated Mother, Grandmother and Great-Grandmother. She never vacationed east to marvel the Smoky (sic) Mountains or west to hear the splashing Pacific, or north to view the majestic Yellowstone National Park, or south to the sights of Mexico. Yet, in the stillness of her heart, she feels she has been there. Because she lives in the hearts of those who have been there! Each year grows sweeter to her. She believed Christ, when he said, "IN MY FATHER'S HOUSE ARE MANY DWELLINGS" (John 14:2) She has faith a dwelling will be ready for her. So do I......
