8	HISTORY OF THE CASE		
9	On June 16, 2011 the Board of Licensed Professional Counselors and Therapists (Board)		
10	issued a Notice of Intent to Revoke License and Right to Request Hearing (Notice) stating that		
11	the Board intended to revoke James B. Mills' (Respondent) license as a Licensed Marriage and		
12	Family Therapist.		
13	The Notice was served on Respondent l	by regular and certified U.S. Mail addressed to	
14	Respondent at Respondent's last known addres	ss – 1937 Westminister Place, Stayton, Oregon	
15	97383 on June 16, 2011. The Notice informed	Respondent of the opportunity for a hearing if	
16	requested in writing and received within twenty	y-one (21) days of service of the Notice. The	
17	Notice further informed Respondent that if a w	ritten request for hearing was not received within	
18	this 21-day period, Respondent's right to a hea	ring shall be considered waived. The Board did	
19	not receive a written request for a hearing from	Respondent within the allotted time and has to	
20	date not received any request for a hearing. Re	spondent is therefore in default.	
21	The Notice also informed Respondent t	hat if he failed to request a hearing, "the Board	
22	may issue a Final Order by Default and revoke	Respondent's license." The Notice further	
23	informed Respondent that in the event the Boar	rd issues a Final Order by Default, the Board	
	designates it file on this matter for purposes of	proving a <i>prima facie</i> case.	

1	NOW, THEREFORE, after consideration of the records and files of the Board relating		
2	to this matter, including all correspondences and other material received from Respondent, if		
3	any, the Board enters the following Findings of Fact, Conclusions of Law, Opinion and Order.		
4	FINDINGS OF FACT		
5	1. The Board of Licensed Professional Counselors and Therapists (Board) is the		
6	state agency responsible for licensing, regulating and disciplining licensed professional		
7	counselors, licensed marriage and family therapists and interns. ORS 675.705 to		
8	675.835; OAR 833-001-0000 to 833-120-0041.		
9	2. James B. Mills (Respondent) is licensed as a Marriage and Family Therapist		
10	(LMFT). The Board has jurisdiction over Respondent under ORS 675.705 to 675.835.		
11	3. The Board has adopted a Code of Ethics (Code) that applies to all licensees. <i>See</i>		
12	OAR 833, Division 100. The Code makes clear that violations of its standards are		
13	subject to the highest level of discipline, including revocation.		
14	4. Respondent was employed by the Oregon State Hospital (OSH) as a trainer and		
15	was responsible for teaching courses to other OSH employees.		
16	5. In November 2010, Respondent was teaching a course to other OSH employees		
17	on motivational interviewing. While teaching the course, Respondent also viewed		
18	pornographic material on his computer.		
19	6. Although Respondent believed no one could see the material, his activities were		
20	uncovered after several employees attending the course observed the pornographic		
21	images on Respondent's computer and reported it to OSH Human Services. These		
22	employees reported that they were unsettled by both the images they saw and the fact		
23	Respondent was reviewing such images while teaching the course.		

1	7.	Respondent admits that he had been caught viewing pornographic material during
2	work	on his work computer and resigned his OSH position because of this misconduct.
3	8.	The Notice was served on Respondent on June 16, 2011 by certified and regular
4	mail.	
5	9.	Respondent failed to timely request a contested case hearing.
6		CONCLUSIONS OF LAW
7	1.	Respondent is in default.
8	2.	Respondent violated ORS 675.745(1)(e) and OAR 833-100-0031(2) when he
9		failed to take reasonable steps to avoid harming his coworkers when his
10		coworkers observed him viewing pornography on his computer while teaching a
11		course.
12	3.	Respondent violated ORS 675.745(1)(e) and OAR 833-100-0041(1) when he
13		failed to act in accordance with the highest standards of professional integrity and
14		competence in his capacity as a professional therapist when he was observed
15		viewing pornographic material on his computer while teaching a course to his
16		coworkers.
17	4.	Respondent violated ORS 675.745(1)(e) and OAR 833-100-0061(1) when he
18		failed to conform to higher standards of conduct and refrain from any conduct that
19		would bring discredit to the profession when he viewed pornographic images
20		from his computer while teaching a course to his coworkers.
21	5.	The appropriate discipline for Respondent's misconduct is the revocation of his
22		LMFT license.
23		

6. The Board is entitled to recover all costs associated with pursuing this disciplinary	
matter under ORS 674.745(7).	
OPINION	
The Board takes its responsibility to enforce the Code of Ethics seriously. When	
Respondent applied for licensure as a LMFT, he accepted the obligation to conform to higher	
standards of conduct. Instead of focusing on the course he was teaching, Respondent admitted	
that he spent his time in part viewing pornography on his computer.	
His lapse in judgment was compounded by the fact his coworkers were able to see the	
pornographic images on his computer. Several coworkers became upset by both the graphic	
images on the computer and the realization that Respondent was looking at such images when he	
was suppose to be teaching the course to them.	
The Board concludes that persons who would engage in such conduct have no place in	
the counseling profession. As such, the only appropriate sanction is to revoke Respondent's	
license.	
The Board is also entitled to be reimbursed for pursuing this disciplinary action. The	
only costs incurred are the attorney fees associated with preparing the Notice and Final Order as	
follows:	
1.3 hours at \$137/per hour = \$178.10 1.4 hours at \$143/per hour = \$228.80	
Total DOJ Costs \$406.90	

1	FINAL ORDER
2	NOW THEREFORE, the Board hereby ORDERS that:
3	1. Respondent James B Mills' license as a Licensed Family and Marriage Therapist is REVOKED ; and
4	2. Respondent is ASSESSED the Board's costs associated with this action,
5	including the Board's attorney fees, in the amount of \$406.90 , pursuant to ORS 675.745(7). The costs must be paid 30 days from the date this Final Order is
6	issued by the Board.
