Presenter: Daniel W. Shaw, DMD, MSD



Dr. Shaw has been involved in pediatric dentistry in several ways. For 5 years he was a full-time faculty member in pediatric dentistry at the University of Minnesota School of Dentistry; then

he directed an inner-city children's dental clinic in Seattle. He was in private practice in solo and group settings for 25 years. Recently he returned to the University of Minnesota School of Dentistry where he serves as a Clinical Associate Professor in the Division of Pediatric Dentistry. His current focus is clinical instruction with dental students and pediatric dental residents. Additionally he serves as an examiner for the American Board of Pediatric Dentistry. Over the years he has presented many continuing education programs for dentists and primary care physicians.

Dr. Shaw has served on several district, state and national level committees in the American Dental Association and the American Academy of Pediatric Dentistry. He is a past president of the Minnesota Dental Association. He is also a Diplomate of the American Board of Pediatric Dentistry and a Fellow in the International College of Dentists.

Presenter: Robert S. Jones DDS, Ph.D.



Dr. Jones joined the University of Minnesota Pediatric Dental Faculty in 2009. Dr. Jones completed his DDS (2003), PhD (2006), and Pediatric Dentistry residency (2009) at the University of

California, San Francisco.

His current research involves examining biological factors in Early Childhood Caries and detecting early incipient and secondary caries using novel near infrared imaging systems. Dr. Jones is a co-inventor of a patented early detection imaging system that may enter the commercial marketplace in the next few years. Dr. Jones is a 2010 recipient of the Faculty Development Award from the 3M Foundation. He is also a Co-PI on a \$1.5 million NIH Ro1 grant (Sept 2010) examining how oral biofilms affect dental resin composites in primary teeth.
