During Opening Week and at any point during the academic year you receive a new roommate, you and your roommates should discuss your shared expectations for living together and complete a Roommate Agreement Form. By establishing ground rules early, roommates increase their chances of having a positive experience!

Set aside some time—at least a half hour—to devote to completing the agreement. By honestly expressing your feelings and reactions to these topics, you will find it easier to understand and empathize with each other during the trials and tribulations of college life. When conflicts arise, revisiting these topics and communicating openly can help resolve disputes before they become unsolvable. If you find yourselves faced with a particularly difficult situation, talk with your roommate first, then your Resident Advisor: it all comes down to respectful communication. Policies described in Living In and your Student Housing License Agreement should be considered during your discussion when appropriate. This agreement will be reviewed in six weeks' time.
