- A combined score equivalent to the 30th percentile or higher on the Graduate Record Examination General Test. Information about taking the exam can be found at <u>www.gre.org</u> (Your score is determined by adding the verbal and analytical portions of the exam). If you previously completed a master's degree, please discuss this with the special education advisor.
- _____ Three letters of recommendation.
- A completed admissions application to the Graduate School, <u>www.grad.niu.edu</u>. (A **complete** graduate application includes, a completed application, payment an application fee, official transcripts, required test scores, career goals statement, and letters of recommendation).
- Successful completion of the **Illinois State Licensure Testing System** <u>Test of Academic</u> <u>Proficiency</u> #400. You can find information and a study guide for this test located at <u>http://www.il.nesinc.com</u>. ACT scores can be used in lieu of the TAP please contact the advisor for additional information If you choose this option you must contact the program advisor to make sure all of the correct paper work is filed.

TB Test (within a calendar year before clinicals; provide graduate secretary with evidence of negative result issued by medical office): It is your responsibility to bring in a current TB Clearance card to the SEED Graduate Secretary (GA 162). You cannot student teach without a valid TB card.

Prior to Licensure:

Assessment of Professional Teaching (APT) # 188 is required for Licensure you should take this test while student teaching or during your last semester. The following test must be completed in order to process your teaching license application. You can locate additional information at <u>www.il.nesinc.com</u>

NIU has to have your official "pass" score on file before sending your information to enable you to be licensed, so if you choose to take the test while student teaching, it must be prior to mid term of the semester.
