DIAF (DECS IMPROVEMENT AND ACCOUNTABILITY FRAMEWORK) VALIDATION

Yesterday our school participated in a DIAF Validation process. This process evaluates in a 'snap shot' our work across the last 3 – 4 years and our directions for 2011. The DIAF Validation is a self review process which reflects on the data that we have used as a school to develop and continuously improve. We were successfully validated and I'd like to thank all who contributed to this process.

Uniforms 2011

Governing Council is strongly supportive of the school uniform being consistently worn throughout the school year. I have included a brief summary of the uniform policy, please stick strictly to the clothing described in this policy when purchasing your children's uniforms for 2011.

School Uniform

This is determined by the Uniform Committee in consultation with the Governing Council, Staff and Student Representative Council. It is strongly endorsed by the parent community. New clothing is available for purchase from Cleve Area School.

NB: marled shirts and check pleated skirts no longer available.

Girls

Fabric check pleated skirt or navy skirt
Check dress
Navy school shorts
Plain navy school pants
Navy or light blue shirt/skivvy with Cleve Area School woven into the bands
Navy or white school socks, navy tights
Navy school windcheater or ½ zip polar fleece jumper

Boys

Plain navy school pants
Navy or light blue shirt/skivvy
Plain navy school shorts with pockets
Navy or white school socks
Navy school windcheater or ½ zip polar fleece jumper

Footwear

Leather shoes, boots, school sandals, sneakers, joggers in– black, navy or brown
Thongs or beach/backless sandals are NOT acceptable.

General

The only acceptable jewellery is studs or sleepers and a watch
Make-up is not to be worn
A supply of new uniforms is available from the school, navy shorts and pants from LENMACS
School Bags are available from the school
Year 11 special navy/light blue shirt
Year 12 special navy school windcheater

Additional shirts or jumpers for Special Events

All special events shirts/jumpers i.e. Year 12 jumpers, Pedal Prix shirts, etc to be approved by the Uniform committee. Shirts to be in navy or sky only.

Special Regulations

Students working in Science, Technical Studies, Home Economics or Agriculture MUST wear covered in shoes and restrictions on jewellery worn will also apply to meet with safety regulations.

Special Recommendation

(Term 1 & Term 4) School sun smart policy will be adhered to. When outdoors, it is policy that each student wears a school hat, plain navy bucket or broad brim hats

Building Progress

Our new building is basically completed with only a few minor works to be completed. It is hoped that our preliminary furniture purchases will be here in week 9 so that we can set up classrooms before Christmas. All other purchases will occur once DECS have transferred the remainder of our Furniture, Fixtures and Expenditure Funding for the new building to our school.

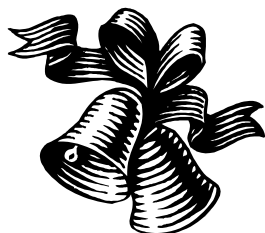

I hope you feel very proud of your achievement in the 2010 Premier's Reading Challenge as the certificates and medals are awarded and you celebrate the occasion.

You have helped to make this another successful year, with 97 per cent of all schools in South Australia involved and well over 115,000 students completing the Challenge.

The Premier's Reading Challenge is now in its seventh year and more than 7,000 students will be receiving the very first Hall of Fame medals. These students started the Challenge in 2004 and have completed the Challenge every year since it began.

To recognise this fantastic achievement, all students receiving the Hall of Fame medal have the opportunity for their name to be included in the new Hall of Fame Honour Roll on the Premier's Reading Challenge website. Every year, the new students who achieve Hall of Fame status will be added to this Honour Roll.

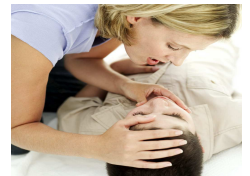
