2006 PORTFOLIO GUIDELINES SUBMISSION REQUIREMENTS:

The Graduate Program of the School of Architecture at the University of Kentucky College of Design evaluates portfolios for breadth and variety of media, scale, and subject matter. Within the limitations given below, the portfolio should demonstrate ability in areas of architectural design and communication. The graduate admissions committee will evaluate portfolios for competence in architectural design, coherent demonstration of visual and spatial abilities expressed through a basic understanding of material and construction, drawing ability, and the use of color in two-dimensional and three-dimensional work. Portfolios should present visual acuity and graphic abilities through paintings, drawings, prints, graphic design, or architectural drawings. We recommend that applicants include freehand drawings from direct observation as well as a selection of plans, sections, and elevations.

Prospective students should clearly identify all work as academic, professional or personal. Examples may be solutions to problems from architectural design courses; sketches and renderings from art, architecture, or interior design courses; and working drawings. Examples of work in individual studies in architecture history, structures, building technology, environmental technology, architectural theory, criticism, methodology, and social-behavioral problems are also admissible. If professional or team projects are included in the portfolio, the specific role and responsibility of the applicant in the production of the project must be clearly identified. Such examples shall have a letter from the employer appended that clearly states the extent of the work actually performed by the applicant.

In order to assure a fair evaluation by each committee member, it is imperative that all applicants adhere to certain standards in format of all application materials. Students currently enrolled in an undergraduate architecture program should submit representative work from each academic year (maximum two pages per semester). Students with a previously-earned Bachelor of Architecture degree may submit design work completed after graduation in lieu of academic work if appropriate.

The portfolio should not exceed 9"x12" binder size in overall dimensions and be bound on the edge. The portfolio should not exceed 20 sheets of 8.5"x 11" drawings, photos, or text, should not measure more than ½ inch in thickness, and should weigh less than 16 ounces. Slides, if used, must be seamlessly integrated into the portfolio package. Elaborately designed portfolio covers are strongly discouraged. Applicants are encouraged to use a high-quality rod binder portfolio, such as a Prat Classic 112, which is available with one set of ten double-sided sheet protectors. Please no 3-ring binders or spiral binding, as this portfolio will become a part of your permanent academic file. Portfolios will NOT be returned to applicants.

PORTFOLIO DO'S AND DON'TS

D0:

Use a standard binder to hold the pages. Use only one binder.

Use copies on 8 1/2" x 11" pages or in plastic inserts.

Use prints of slides and insert in portfolio.

Make copies of large drawings or parts of drawings, reduce to 8 1/2" X 11" format and insert in portfolio.

Write a maximum of a 250-word abstract with an explanation or summary of each project.

Accompany exhibits of work with brief statements of intent, degree of involvement (where not self-evident) and/or the rationale for the work.

Select samples carefully. They should show breadth of skill and ability, not necessarily development.

The best work in a given media or subject is preferable to a whole - range or sequence of works.

Organize the portfolio to show work in a supportive and clear format.

DO NOT:

Exceed the binder size.

Submit loose original work, or separate items.

Submit rolled or folded prints or drawings.

Submit lengthy written papers/reports.

Submit work for which authorship is left in question.

Submit more than one portfolio.
