## Principal's Message

As we enter the month of November, we will begin our preparations for our big Chinese New Year celebration concert on January 21<sup>st</sup>. This year we are doing it early (Chinese New Year actually falls on February 19<sup>th</sup>) because the Jubilee Auditorium was not available during the month of February. For those of you that are new to Highwood School, this is the highlight of our school year where culture, tradition, art and language learning all come together to create an inspirational and meaningful performance. This year we are partnering with Trickster Theatre, who is a professional theatre group who will come in and work with the students to co-create their performances. Special thanks to the group of parents who have already volunteered their time to help build large props and backdrops that are crucial to the performances. Ticket sales will begin in early January after we return from Winter Break.

We are also approaching our first set of report cards. They will be distributed on Friday, December 12 and parent teacher interviews will occur on Thursday, December 18<sup>th</sup> and Friday, December 19<sup>th</sup>. It is important to note that there is a new K-9 report card that all CBE schools will begin using. Students will no longer be graded on a 1-5 scale, but now it will be a 1-4 scale. Each grade number is defined like this:

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4	Excellent	The student has demonstrated excellent achievement of grade level expectations.	The student demonstrates a subtle and thorough understanding.  The student uses knowledge and skills to engage in complex learning tasks.  The student experiences success in novel, diverse, and unique learning situations.	
3	Good	The student has demonstrated good achievement of grade level expectations.	The student demonstrates an in-depth and well-developed understanding.  The student uses knowledge and skills to engage in a variety of learning tasks.  The student experiences success in familiar and new learning situations.	
2	Basic	The student has demonstrated basic achievement of grade level expectations.	The student demonstrates an adequate and simplistic understanding.  The student uses knowledge and skills to engage in common learning tasks.  The student experiences success in familiar learning situations.	
1	Not Meeting	The student is not meeting grade level expectations.	The student demonstrates limited and insufficient understanding.  The student struggles to use knowledge and skills to engage in learning tasks.  The student can experience success when learning situations are rehearsed and highly structured.

## **MILK CARDS**



As we are trying to promote healthy choices in the lunchroom, we are continuing the milk program at Highwood School. This means that students can buy milk cards at the office for \$10 (good for 12 milks). Milk cards from last year will still be accepted. Students can choose from white milk or sugar reduced chocolate milk. Milk cards are the responsibility of the students and lost cards will not be replaced.

## **ALLERGIES**



Due to student allergies, we always tell students that they CANNOT share food with each other during lunch or snack time. Although we are not a peanut free school, we ask that you be considerate of those with allergies and try not to pack lunches or snacks with peanuts or peanut butter. If your child has any allergies, please ensure that the office and your child's teacher know of this and also has an emergency plan in place. Any medications need to be left at the office along with a signed consent form to allow office staff to administer the medication as necessary. Students are not to take medication on their own for safety reasons.







## Changed your contact and personal information?

It is very important that the school has the most up to date contact information for each student in case of an emergency. If you have changed your home, work, or cell phone number since September and have not notified the school of this change, please do so immediately so that our computer system can be updated. The same goes for any of your emergency contacts that you may have listed (i.e. grandparents, friends, and relatives).

We also understand that sometimes legal custody arrangements between separated parents exist and change. The school must have copies of any legal custody agreements between parents in order for them to be enforced at the school. They also must be the most recent. Otherwise, both parents have legal custody of the child and therefore have access to them and information regarding the child.



## **Paperless Agendas and D2L**

D2L (Desire 2 Learn) is an online system that CBE students and teachers use to support student learning. In an effort to conserve paper, we are using paperless agendas this year, and all agenda items will be posted on D2L. For students who were at Highwood School last year, logging in to D2L will be the same as before. For new students, we will provide you with instructions in the coming days. It is an expectation that parents along with their child to check D2L on a daily basis for agenda messages as well as for on-line learning supports.


## \*\*\*Kindergarten bussing on these days:

#### build | CBE capital project update

This fall the Calgary Board of Education welcomed more than 3,700 new students to bring our total enrolment to a record number of nearly 114,500 students. And we know the growth won't stop there. We are expected to grow by another 15,000 students over the next five years.

As a result, the CBE is facing pressures for more space for students throughout our system. These pressures are highest in newer communities that don't have community schools and at the elementary level where more than 2,700 additional students enrolled in Grades 1 through 6 this year. This pressure will continue to be felt in junior and senior high schools as our students age and move through the system.

Our role as a Board is to continue to work with the Government of Alberta to request new schools, modernization projects and modular classrooms. The Province determines which schools are funded and how they will be built.

Currently, the CBE has 31 capital projects underway, including replacement schools and modernization projects. We are scheduled to open 17 new schools in September 2016.

As well, the Province made two announcements this fall to partner with the CBE to build additional school projects in the communities of: West Springs/Cougar Ridge, Saddle Ridge, Cranston, Aspen Woods, Martindale, Silverado and Springbank Hill/Discovery Ridge.

The government also provided funding for modular classrooms for Westgate School, a new south Calgary high school and major modernization projects at James Fowler and Lord Beaverbrook high schools.

The CBE is grateful to the government for this investment in education.

#### **Updated Ranking Criteria for Capital Projects**

This spring the CBE carried out a review of the ranking criteria to be used for school capital planning. Each year the CBE submits plans to the Province for three types of capital projects: new schools, modernization of existing schools, and modulars. The CBE ranks the priority of each of these projects and submits the plans to Alberta Education for

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funding each year. Alberta Education then decides which projects to fund.

The review of the ranking criteria was carried out to ensure that the criteria were complete and fair. The process included extensive public engagement which resulted in several changes and adjustments. Public participants agreed that the revised criteria incorporated their input and were non-discriminatory in the method for ranking communities and projects.

For new K-9 schools, the ranking criteria used includes all pre-school children, actual distance of the community to the overflow school and five year future community growth. This data is updated annually with the most recent city census numbers.

The review also adjusted the ranking criteria for modernizations and, for the first time, created objective ranking criteria for modulars. These criteria can be viewed on the CBE web site at:

The new ranking criteria are now in use by the CBE. A new modular classroom plan was approved at the Oct. 14 Board meeting. The CBE will be requesting 28 modular classrooms for 11 schools across the system. New school and modernization requests will be presented in the Three-Year School Capital Plan in the spring 2015.
