Hope For Haiti!

On the day of the carnival, people in the MeToWe club were performing songs and doing speeches on the stage for everyone to watch and be entertained while waiting to play games. There were games at the carnival for everyone to play and have fun. The games and booths were all based on Haiti and were designed to look like homes in Haiti. They also provided free food, beans and rice, that tasted better then it looked. The students were buying popcorn, juice and bracelets that were a reasonable price. Raising money was challenging but at the end it was for a good cause.

The MeToWe group started a legacy. For next year's MeToWe club, they shouldn't have a carnival because people didn't pay as much attention to what we had to say about Haiti. There was a lot of information about Haiti that no one really seemed to pay attention to, the students just wanted to play the games. We wish more students learned about Haiti. That's what next year's MeToWe group should work on.

Paying your child's school fees online is quick, easy and convenient.

To set up an account, your email address must match what the school has on file and you will need your child's CBE student ID.

- 1 ensure you are listed as the legal guardian for your child
- 2 visit cbe.ab.ca and click on online fee payment to register for a My CBE Account
- 3 add your child(ren) using their CBE student ID

Once you register for a My CBE Account you can:

- pay for noon supervision, transportation, 1 instructional supplies and materials and many other student fees
- register for noon supervision


