- The Healthcare Marketplace, created by the Affordable Care Act, opened Oct 1. As providers of Internet access and digital literacy training for patrons, public libraries can anticipate intensified demand for computer services. To assist public librarians with this anticipated need, the State Library of Ohio has put together trainings and other resources for library staff.
