Principal's Message

Welcome back to the many families who are returning to Woodbine School! It is wonderful to have you all back. For those who are new to Woodbine, we would like to extend a very warm welcome and we are looking forward to getting to know you!

The staff at Woodbine School have been very busy planning and preparing to make this a wonderful year for our students. We would like welcome Mr. Craig Mansell who will be teaching grade 6 and to the new EDC Program team made up of Ms. Sarah Cameron (Program Teacher), Christine McKinnon and Kyle Gustafson (Educational Assistants), Jennifer Moore (Speech and Language Pathologist) and Lauren Schumacher (Speech and Language Assistant). We also welcome back Miss Amanda Kindree who is teaching in grade 6 while Mrs. Ellis is on leave. Please read on for a full listing of Woodbine School staff for the upcoming school year.

Please note that the student classroom placements are still tentative, as adjustments may be necessary due to an increase or decrease in student enrolment. We will strive to make any necessary changes quickly and any students/parents affected will be contacted.

The Parent/Student/Teacher Conference is an important part of the student reporting process. The purpose of the initial conference is to exchange important information about your child and to establish a close working relationship between home and school. The first set of conferences for this school year is scheduled for the evening of Thursday, September 18th from 5:00 to 8:00 pm and again on Friday, September 19th from 8:00 am to noon. Reminder you need to submit your charter transportation contracts!

- Bus stops are established based on charter transportation contracts received in the Transportation office prior to **June 26**th. We cannot anticipate where you live and cannot establish a bus stop without a completed contract.
- Bus stops/routes will not be changed for any contract received after June 26th.
- If you have missed the deadline and there is no bus stop within the prescribed distance from your residence, you must submit a Charter Transportation Change Request form which may take up to 8 weeks to process. The form is available on the web site www.cbe.ab.ca/transportation/default.asp.

HOW TO PAY YOUR FEES for 2014/2015

The school will accept payment:

- By VISA, MasterCard, VISA Debit or Interac Online payment at the CBE online fee payment website (See below).
- By VISA, MasterCard or Debit Card at the school, through a POS (Point of Sale) terminal
- By cheque, delivered to the school. A charge of \$25.00 will be made for NSF (nonsufficient funds) cheques to defray bank charges and related school costs.
- In cash, delivered to the school.

NOON SUPERVISION PROGRAM



Woodbine School will continue with its operation of a Noon Supervision Service. This service is optional and is offered on a <u>user pay basis only</u>. Students who are bus eligible and do not ride the bus must pay for lunchroom. **PLEASE NOTE: Bus riders must now pay for the use of the lunchroom service**. Students are supervised while they are eating and outside during their free time.

Registration forms for the 2014 - 2015 school year were sent home June 2014. If you have not returned the registration form to the school could you please do so as soon as possible. The lunchroom will be in operation on the first day of school. Please direct any inquiries to Ms. Dennis at (403) 777-8630 ext 2.

If a student is going to be <u>absent</u> from the lunchroom program or would like to access the **drop-in** program, a parent needs to call the lunchroom line before <u>11:45 a.m.</u>

• If your child is going to go to a friend's house for lunch, we need to have written permission from both sets of parents before we can allow your child to leave the school property.

STUDENT ABSENCES AND LATES



If your child is going to be absent or late, parents are asked to contact our absentee line at (403) 777-8630 ext. "1" and leave a message. Messages should be left prior to 8:30 a.m. for the morning attendance and 12:45 p.m. for the afternoon attendance. This is a 24 hour automated phone line, so messages can be left in the evening for the next school day. Messages are greatly appreciated as they save the office a lot of time and concern.

We look forward to having all students arrive at school on time! This is beneficial to their learning and to the learning of all students in their classroom. We ask all parents who bring their children to and from school to please be respectful of our school hours. We ask that students arrive at school between 8:20 and 8:30, allowing them the opportunity to connect with their classmates before the school day begins. Should your child be late for school, they must report to the school office prior to going to their classroom.

PHONE CALLS



Phone calls to students will <u>not</u> be put through to classrooms. We will be happy to take a message and have your child call you back when it is not disruptive to the classroom learning time. If it is an urgent call, we will call your child down to the office to speak to you. The office phone is for emergencies only. It is not to be used by parents or by the children to arrange play dates, etc.

VOLUNTEER POLICE CLEARANCES



Please ensure that if you would like to volunteer in the school this year, you must have received clearance from the Calgary City Police via the Calgary Board of Education before you will be allowed to do so. Clearances from any other agency are not accepted. Please come into the school office for your application form. There is no charge for this clearance. You will be contacted when the clearance is approved. Clearances are only valid for 5 years.

Volunteer Registration Forms must be completed every year. One form is included in the start-up package. Additional forms are available in the office.

WOODBINE SCHOOL SAFETY PATROLS



Woodbine School Safety Patrols will begin Monday, September 15^{th} , 2014. Many of our patrollers are new to the patroller program so we request that you please be patient while we get our routines in place.

Just a reminder that drivers are to stop when the patroller has the stop sign raised and are to remain at a standstill until the lieutenant gives the whistle signal for the signs to come down.

To further ensure the safety of our students we ask that parents do not drop off students in the parking lot.

VOLUNTEERS/VISITORS (PARENTS) TO WOODBINE

Please sign in/out at the office when you are coming into the school, even if you are only going to be a few minutes. You need will wear a name tag (Visitor or your Volunteer badge) when you are in the school. If you borrow a visitors badge please return it before you leave the school when you sign out. If you are dropping off items for your child, please leave the item (Lunch, homework, etc.) with the office staff. They will deliver the item to your child when it is the least disruptive to the class.

NO PARKING or STOPPING IN the BUS ZONE

The bus zone in front of the school is a NO PARKING/NO STOPPING zone from 7:00 AM to 5:00 PM ALL school days! Please **do not** park to run into the school or drop your child off in this zone.

CROSSING SAFELY

Students and parents are expected to use the marked crosswalks and refrain from jaywalking across the street anywhere in the school zone.

MEDICATION

If your child requires any medication to be at the school, please complete the required forms and return to the office. These forms do not carry forward and need to completed each school year.

A new school year provides exciting new opportunities for both students and parents to get involved in their school community. For parents, that might mean volunteering at the school and getting involved in the school council.

School councils are one of the most significant ways parents, students and community members can make a meaningful difference in the lives of our students.

We know that parent support doesn't happen just at the school. Many parents help their child to be successful through active support at home.

The school council acts as an advisory body to the school leadership team. School councils can provide advice on the development of many issues relevant to matters that affect every student, including the development of the school's

- · mission, vision and philosophy,
- · policies,
- · annual education plan,
- · annual results report, and
- budget.

School councils are provided with the school's provincial testing program results and other provincial measures, as well as a reasonable interpretation of those results and measures.

We encourage you to get involved in your school council. It contributes to the effective communication that builds relationships and a shared understanding of needs, expectations and values within your school community.

The CBE also has a Council of School Councils (COSC). Through COSC, each CBE school has a voice to speak to the Board of Trustees and the system, not just to their schools and principals.

The Council of School Councils is comprised of school council chairs (or appropriate designates), members of

the Board of Trustees and representatives from CBE administration. Its purpose is to give CBE leaders and parents an opportunity to work together, share information, discuss concerns and plan for the future.

The Board values the knowledge, ideas and suggestions school councils provide and the work they do to support and enhance student learning.

Our students are among the most successful in the world and that is due in part to the active involvement of parents and community members. We want to hear from school councils and work with them to make Calgary's public education system even better.

We look forward to meeting school council chairs and/or designates at the next COSC meeting on Tuesday, Sept. 30, at 6:30 p.m. The meeting will be held at the Education Centre, 1221 – 8th Street SW. Free parking is available for attendees.
