Satisfactory Academic Progress (SAP) Appeal Information:

In order to be considered for financial aid at UNC Charlotte, students must meet certain standards of academic progress as described in the Satisfactory Academic Progress (SAP) policy available online at http://finaid.uncc.edu/keepingyour-aid/satisfactory-academic-progress. These standards include a minimum cumulative UNC Charlotte grade point average, a minimum credit hour completion rate of UNCC attempted credit hours plus transfer credit hours, and the completion of a degree within a maximum timeframe. These standards are reviewed for each enrolled student at the end of each semester.

If you lose your financial aid eligibility at the end of the semester, you must submit this appeal form to the Office of Student Financial Aid by the published deadlines in order to request a reconsideration of your eligibility. Otherwise, your academic progress will not be reviewed until the end of the following semester.

Students who become readmitted to UNC Charlotte under a forgiveness policy do not automatically regain financial aid eligibility and are required to submit this appeal form for reconsideration. It is the responsibility of the student to verify that their enrollment status is in "Active" status before appealing.

Students may appeal their unsatisfactory academic status only four times during their academic career at UNC Charlotte. Documented mitigating circumstances may allow additional appeals on a case-by-case basis.

SUMMARY OF SAP REQUIREMENTS

Cumulative Grade Point Average:

- Undergraduate students must have a cumulative GPA of 2.0
- Graduate students must meet the GPA requirements outlined by the Graduate School.

Minimum Credit Hour Completion:

All students must earn at least two-thirds (or 66.6%) of their total attempted credit hours (transfer credits are included).

Maximum Hours for Financial Aid:

- Students can receive financial aid for up to 150% of the credit hours required for degree completion. All credit hours attempted (including transfer credits) are counted.
- ❖ Most undergraduate programs require 120 credits to earn a degree. Students can receive aid for up to 180 credits.
- Graduate students are subject to the requirements outlined by the Graduate School.
