### STUDENT UNION COUPON BOOKS

### **Evacuation Procedures**

During September and October the students and staff will practice several evacuation procedures. We will also practice securing our building in the event of an emergency. Every year students have reviews of these routines for a safe and quick exit of our building. Our school has a comprehensive Emergency Response Plan. It will be reviewed by Mr. Barthel at our first School Council meeting.

## NUT ALLERGY

We have students in our school who have a severe allergy to peanuts and all other nuts. If they come into contact with the residue of peanuts or nuts or ingest peanuts or nuts, they will go into anaphylaxis - one of the most dramatic allergic reactions possible. This reaction occurs rapidly and may result in death through respiratory obstruction or vascular collapse.

The school staff and the Grandview School Council request that you avoid sending snacks or lunches that contain or may contain any nuts, including peanut butter.

#### Does your child stay for lunch?

To make our Lunchroom Program run more smoothly and efficiently, we need the help of our parents in regards to the following issues:

- With 15-25 students in many of our classes, it takes a long time to heat up lunches. We would suggest that you send items that take no longer than one minute to heat up.
- By sending foods that do not need to be heated up everyday, students would be able to finish eating sooner and get outside to play. We ask that you refrain from sending items that require heating up to 2-3 times per week.
- Many foods that need to be cooked take 3 or 4 minutes to heat up (Noodles, Kraft Dinner, etc.) When they are finally cooked, they are extremely hot for the students to eat. We suggest that you precook these types of foods and allow your child to simply reheat them.
- Please do not sent Microwave Popcorn as this will no longer be accepted at our school.
- Please remember to send the necessary cutlery with your child, as we will no longer be supplying plastic cutlery.
- We try to carry some extra lunch items for students who have forgotten their lunches. However, students who have a lunch and request additional items will be asked to let their parents know that they need more food. Please check with your child to ensure that they have enough to eat each day.

# IMPORTANT MESSAGE for SCHOOL VOLUNTEERS

In an effort to maximize the safety of your children and our students, the Red Deer Public School District has requirements for school volunteers.

All adults who volunteer in a school or at a school-sponsored activity, and who will have opportunity to interact with students during the course of their volunteer service, will need to provide the school with a Police Information Check (formerly known as a Criminal Record Check) and two written references that confirm the suitability of the individual to serve as a school volunteer.

The forms are currently available in the school office or on request, may be sent home with your child. If you have completed these forms in past years, it will not be necessary to redo them as the Police Information Check is valid for **five** years.

Thank you for your willingness to serve as a volunteer and for your understanding in meeting these requirements in order to enhance the safety of your children and our students.

### LUNCHROOM POLICY & FEES 2014–2015

The Grandview Lunchroom Program is jointly accountable to school administration and the Grandview School Council. The Red Deer Public School District provides support for a "basic lunch supervision" program for students who are bussed to Grandview from Rosedale, Timberlands & designated Downtown areas. The District pays \$ 7.50 per eligible student per month. At Grandview there is a paid lunchroom supervisor in each classroom. We believe this adult presence promotes appropriate social interaction. In order to accommodate this financial commitment, the following fees apply:

#### Lunchroom Fees:

#### **Rosedale and designated Downtown Bus Students**

\$ 7.50 per child per month *paid by parents* (\$75.00 per year) and remainder subsidized by the Red Deer Public School District.

We would request that payments are made as follows: \$ 37.50 in September and \$ 37.50 in January (*post-dated cheques*) or one payment of \$ 75.00 per child is made in September.

#### All Other Students

\$ 15.00 per month per child, paid by parents.

We require post-dated cheques payable to *Grandview School* or cash payment prior to the beginning of each month.

The Red Deer Public School District requires that all lunch students complete a registration for the lunch program and it *must be accompanied with payment. Thank you.*



- 1.
