### CONSTUCTION SAFETY COORDINATOR- NATIONAL STANDARD

### Who am I?

If you are an individual who is interested in protecting the health and safety of individuals who work in the construction industry, being a Construction Safety Coordinator is the position for you.

## What do I do?

- The Construction Safety Coordinator acts as a resource person for the company on health & safety issues
- Knows what is in the company's Health & Safety program, policies, and procedures for the protection of workers, property, equipment, and the environment
- Must be able to recognize a hazard and assess what is needed to correct or eliminate the hazard
- Acts as a liaison for the company with the Occupational Health & Safety regulatory body and Workers' Health and Safety Compensation Commission
- Acts as a liaison with the company and workers on health & safety issues
- Be able to assess the effectiveness of the health & safety program
- Promotes health & safety by setting a good example

## How do I advance?

The construction industry is in an upswing in New Brunswick. This upswing does not show any decline for the next five years. Should you wish to become a Construction Safety Coordinator in New Brunswick, the opportunities are limitless. The designation Construction Safety Coordinator has been accepted across Canada. If you are interested in this type of position, the work commands respect, not only from your employer and fellow employees, but from government agencies, prime contractors, and construction owners.

## Variety and Travel – Where do I go from here?

Construction Safety Coordinators are in demand. By having the right tools and the willingness to expand your education, where you go and what you do could be limitless. All industries require dedicated people to ensure the health and safety of their workforce.

#### **Education Requirements**

To become a Construction Safety Coordinator, you need to have worked in the construction industry for a minimum of three years and complete the following above list of New Brunswick Construction Safety Association courses:

Other provinces may require additional training, such as representative training for members of joint worksite health and safety committees.

To register in the program, contact the New Brunswick Construction Safety Association. In order to reach the designation of Construction Safety Coordinator, you must:

- Be certified in all the above compulsory and (any three) elective courses, and
- Submit a letter from your employer or a detailed resume that details your industry experience. (minimum of 3 years experience).

Due to the nature of the position, there may be physical and mental demands placed on the Construction Safety Coordinator based on industry requirements. Some of the physical demands may include, but not be limited to: climbing, walking, lifting, bending, driving, etc. Each individual employer needs to identify what the demands are for the position in the company and what limitations may be acceptable to their particular industry.
