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FROM THE PRINCIPAL'S DESK

I would like to take this opportunity to update our community about some recent staffing changes, school renovations and to inform you about the new Power School marking and attendance program.

Ms. Yorke who took an educational leave in the fall to complete her guidance practicum, secured a guidance position at Bell Park Elementary for the remainder of the year and Ms Lebans received a term teaching position at Auburn Dr High School. Ms Monahan has graciously agreed to finish the year in Ms Yorke's position. I would like to wish both teachers the best of luck in their new assignments. Please join me in welcoming Mr. Dempsey who will be joining our English and Social Studies department and Ms. Tomlinson who will be covering for Ms. Keramaris also in the social studies department.

The school renovation project is moving along with 5 more North wing classrooms about to start being constructed and the larger gym receiving new lights, acoustical panels and a MBA quality wooden floor. More on the renovations will be reported in the spring once final drawings for the technology and innovation labs are complete.

Hopefully by now, both students and parents are using the new software Power Schools. Students should see Mr. Stewart to receive their login information. It is important that students have access to this software because this year, for the first time, students, along with their parents at home will be registering for next years courses. Please take the time to review the course selection handbook, which will be coming home early March and review the high school graduation requirements, which is on the front of the current report card. With this software, you now can see whether your child is in class, if they past in that assignment they have been working on or what mark they received on the last test. REPORTING A STUDENT'S ABSENCE

Last October we changed our attendance procedures so that ALL absences are reported home. When a student is absent, the excused code is not entered until the day following the absence. If the absence has been excused, the call still goes home as unexcused and the message now indicates that if you have excused the absence to please disregard the call. As long as you call in or email the absence, you don't need to write a note (although you may if you wish) but you will still receive a call home. When excusing your child's absence, please either use the attached form or ensure you include all of the information on the form. Failure to include the necessary information may result in erroneous reporting of the student's attendance.

Please note that if you excuse your child for being late, their attendance records will still indicate an "L" code for that period as there is no separate code for "Excused Late". Also, if your child's attendance record indicates a "U" (unexcused) for a particular class and they were not absent, they must discuss it with the appropriate teacher and the <u>teacher</u> must contact me to change the code. MENTAL HEALTH DAY

On January 6, the PAHS Youth Health Committee (consisting of students and staff) put on its first ever school-wide Mental Health Day. This school-wide mental health promotion event was intended to decrease stigma and increase awareness of mental illness as well as promote healthy coping skills at a critical time in the school calendar-leading into exams.

The first period of Mental Health Day featured an all-school assembly delivered by Laing House's Youth Speak. Laing House is a peer support organization for youth with mental illness. Our 3 guests were young men who spoke about their experiences with bipolar disorder, psychosis and schizophrenia. They did a great job at combating stigma by helping students understand that mental illnesses are brain illnesses.

The second period featured 35 break-out activities that were focused on coping skills. Prior to the event, students had the opportunity to choose their first and second choices from a list that included sport, creative art, creative writing and music-themed activities. At the beginning of their activity, the staff leader showed a presentation created by Youth Committee detailing mental health diagnoses and also facilitated a dialogue about how the activity of choice can be used to cope with stress.

SCIENCE FAIR 2011

All science ten diploma prep students participated in the 2011 PAHS Science Fair on Monday, January 17. Thirty-two projects entered the competition and three projects were selected to represent Prince Andrew High School at the regional science fair. Kody Crowell's project on diodes, Melissa Mackley and Victoria Cullen's project on the lifespan of a bubble and Dena Pourhamzeh and Priya Gupta's project on laundry detergents will go on to the Halifax Science-Tech Expo on March 18, 2011. Stephanie Johnston, Mitchell Thompson and Najla Salehi were selected as alternates and many additional projects received honourable mention by the volunteer judges. Thank you to all judges including Ms. Christensen, Ms. Cormier, Mr. Dalziel, Mr. Gallant, Mr. Jamieson, Ms. Louth, Ms. MacDonald, Ms. Monaghan, Ms. Regan, and Ms. Skinner. Congratulations to all participants on a very successful science fair. Your commitment, hard work and enthusiasm about your projects was clearly evident.

IB Year 2 students have completed their Extended Essays – a task they should be proud of! The IB Year 1 students are in the beginning stages of their Extended Essays. These students participated in a two-day workshop that focused on developing their topic into a research question and how to go about finding appropriate sources to support their essays. Students and teachers will participate in an Extended Essay workshop at the University of Kings College on Saturday March 5th with IB students from other IB schools in Metro Halifax.

Pre-IB Grade 10 students had an opportunity to ask questions and to meet students in the IB diploma program at an ice cream social organised by IB year 1 student Alysha Roberts.

IB Year 2 students will be completing the remaining Internal Assessment pieces in the next little while and gearing up for the exam session beginning on May 3rd. Final IB Examinations will be conducted in a quiet, academic space at the Akerley Campus of the NSCC with the exception of the IB French exam that will be written at Prince Andrew on May 23rd.
