My Grandparents grew these old flavorful fruiting berries in 1944 for many years!

Friends and customers of my Grandparents would look forward to harvesting the fine blueberry flavors from the productive plants.

BB-R-8100 ATLANTIC was popular in 1939 thru the 60's and was the dessert quality of heirloom fruits. Fruits were used to make preserves and delicious pies. The medium blue fruits ripen beginning of August. The bushes are spreading wide and grow to 4 feet in height.



BB-R-8200 PIONEER grown in Michigan and New Jersey in 1920's thru the 40's. The fruits are excellent when eaten fresh from the plants or for any desserts. The deep blue fruits are small and are borne on long clusters, so they are easily picked. Fruits are highly aromatic, our Fathers favorite blueberry for eating fresh from the bush!

BB-R-8300 STANLEY was a popular commercial variety in 1930 thru the 50's. The medium size fruits have a distinct aroma of the sweet blueberry flavor. Fruits have excellent dessert quality, or just eat the deep blue fruits fresh from the plants. The plants are erect and have good vigor with a good show of colors every autumn.

Our Northern varieties have all been triple tested for winter hardiness, delicious flavor and high yields. Also, they have different maturity seasons, ensuring a continuous crop of fruit all summer. These are the largest, sweetest, juiciest blueberries you can grow. Indeed, Blue Crop grows fruit as large as cherries - without the pits! All varieties are self-pollinating but set largest crops from cross-pollination.

BLUE CROP - BB-R-4800. Mid-season. Highly frost-resistant. Consistently overbears. Large, light blue berries. Up to 10 quarts of berries per bush. The most vigorous blueberry for northern climates. Zones 4-7.

BLUE RAY - BB-R-0400. Known as the Hotel Blueberry because of its large fruit size and wonderful flavor. Every year the plants produce a minimum of 15 pounds and as high as 25 pounds of fruit. The 5-foot bush is upright with large glossy green leaves. Foliage is fiery red and orange in the autumn. Hardiness Zone 4-7.

CHANTICLEER - BB-R-4600. The first blue fruits to ripen! Chanticleer will produce the first fruits to begin the blueberry season. The tasty fruits ripen 5 days earlier than all of the earliest cultivar, so enjoy the blue fruits earlier. Fruits are medium in size with fine sweet mild flavor. Zones 5-7.

JERSEY - BB-R-1000. This variety is an all time favorite blueberry with a distinctly sweet flavor. Long clusters of medium size fruits are prolific on the 6 foot tall bush. The plants are vigorous in most any soil, therefore Jersey is widely planted by commercial growers in Michigan. An excellent choice for berries to ripen after Blue Ray. Zones 4-8.

NORTHLAND - BB-R-1300. Sweet wild flavored berry. Fifteen pounds of nutritious berries can be harvested every year from this 4 foot tall bush. Medium to small deep blue fruits are full of the sweet flavors of the wild blueberry that makes the best blueberry muffins and pies. The plant adapts well in cold climates and heavy snowfalls will not harm the willowy branches. Fruits ripen early to mid-season; a wonderful compliment to our Blue Ray. Zones 4-7.

RUBEL BLUEBERRY

Rubel is a native selected from the pine barrens of New Jersey. This cultivar obtained commercial acceptance in the early 1900's and is still produced by blueberry growers today. The fruits are small and so flavorful that one of our long time friends requests that I only give her fruits of the Rubel variety. She claims Rubel makes the best pies and pastries.

The bush grows tall, up and 8 feet high, and spreads outward to 4 feet. Yields are consistently high, up to 15 pounds of fruit per year.



Rubel is a great ornamental shrub. The long slender deep green leaves will turn a burgundy red in the autumn and red twigs in the winter. Flowers in the spring are numerous with sweet aroma. Zones 4-8.

These plants are cold hardy to -35°F . Each fruiting-size plant is properly labeled eager to produce beautiful flowers and a modest-crop of fruit the first year, then begin cropping heavily the following year and every year thereafter. Though plants are self-pollinating, for best results plant one of each variety.

CHIPPEWA - BB-R-1900. Finally we have an extremely arctic hardy blueberry plant that grows to a height of 3 feet tall. The fruits are medium to large and produce huge crops despite the coldest weather conditions. The berries are prized for their firmness, attractive color and delicious wild-like flavor that makes blueberries so popular. Zones 3-7.

NORTH BLUE - BB-R-2100. Mid-season. Bushy, spreading plants developed by the University of Minnesota. Grows just 2-3 ft. high, bearing large navy-blue fruits producing an appealing tart-sweet flavor. Highest yielding Arctic blueberry - up to 5 quarts (7lbs.) per plant. Brilliant red fall color.

POLARIS - BB-R-5500. Extend the harvest season with this new variety. Harvest at least 2 weeks after Chippewa has finished with its last fruits. The 3-foot tall plant will yield up to 8 pounds of berries every year. Zones 3-8.

HEAT-TOLERANT, DROUGHT-TOLERANT FOR SOUTHERN GARDENS

Blueberries are such a widespread North American plant they can be found well into Canada, close to the Arctic Circle, and as far south as the Florida Everglades. We list here the seven best varieties for Southern conditions. They are especially suitable for the Carolinas south to Texas and Southern Florida on the east coast, also Arizona, New Mexico and Southern California. Choose independently, or let us choose the varieties we know will do best in your area.



SHARPLUE - BB-R-3800. This variety is the oldest and most widely planted blueberry because it is the best-flavored and consistent producer. Plants grow 5 to 6 feet producing up to 18 pounds of berries per plant; all of good flavor. Zones 8-11.

MISTY - BB-R-3400. Misty is known for consistently high yields of medium sized high flavored berries. The deep green foliage is evergreen in most warm climate areas. Fruits ripen 10 days after the earliest, Sharpblue. Zones 8-11.

REVELLIE - BB-R-5200. A great midseason, large fruit variety. The berries are light blue and are sweet with a hint of acidity. Zones 5-9.

LEGACY - BB-R-5100. Rated as the highest flavor blueberry overall. High production of medium sized light blue fruit are firm and will keep you with fresh berries for up to 6 weeks or longer. Zones 5-9.



BILOXI - BB-R-3900. A Southern Highbush variety that is suited for hot weather and adaptable to many different soils. Biloxi's flavor rates highly; 8.5 out of 10. It grows vigorously to 5 feet at maturity and 3 feet wide yielding up to 12 pounds per plant. Berries ripen late April in Zone 10, and later in Zones 8-9. Biloxi is a great selection for the Southeastern U.S. Zones 8-11

CLIMAX - BB-R-3200. A popular Rabbiteye type Blueberry. Berries are sky blue, medium size and full of flavor. Harvest the first crops one week after Premier. Premier is a good choice for the pollinator of Climax.

BRIGHTWELL - BB-R-5000. The latest blueberry to ripen. This one will extend the Southern blueberry season to 3 months, beginning with Sharpblue. Fruits are full of mouth-watering sweetness. For good pollination plant with Climax.

When traveling through Europe, acres upon acres of and Gooseberries can be seen growing, to supply the demands of the people. There are only several selected varieties that are commercially grown there despite 100's of varieties that have been cultivated since the early 1500's. We've selected these delicious fruits from Europe for our customers. Since the fruits are new to the U.S. markets, we knew we needed these new varieties that offer the best sweet tart flavor and vitamin rich nutrition that the old world plants bear.

The varieties we have chosen for you are:

HINNONMAKI RED GOOSEBERRY –

GB-R-0400 A large gooseberry with a sweetly rich deep red flesh, and tangy outer skin. No guessing when ripe, just pick the berries when they turn red. Hinnonmaki is a fine dessert berry; eat fresh or enjoy in pies, jams, and jellies. Zones 4-8.



POORMAN GOOSEBERRY – GB-R-0700. Considered the best American cultivar; developed in Utah, and released in 1888. Poorman's medium pear shaped fruits turn pink when ripe and have a pleasant sweet-tart flavor. The plants reach 3 to 4 feet at maturity and are vigorous, high yielding, and less thorny than other varieties. This gooseberry is great for fresh eating and cooking. Zones 4-10.

Elderberries yield fruits that are highly nutritious. They are an excellent source of vitamins and antioxidants for humans. Wildlife also enjoys the fruits. Research has shown that the berries from the elderberry can strengthen the immune system to fight viruses.

The multi-stemmed shrubs, 8 feet tall and 3 feet wide have landscape interest as well. Large creamy white flowers attract butterflies and other nectar loving birds.

Plants produce clusters of black fruit that drape each branch. Fall color is outstanding, yellow to red-orange foliage that brightens the landscape.

Johns is a true native plant of North America. The plant will produce 30 pounds of berries annually; it is the highest yielding variety. Zones 3-8.

NEW HARDY ARCTIC KIWI

Even if the Hardy Arctic Kiwi didn't produce fruit, you'd want to grow it as a decorative broad-leafed flowering vine that is not troubled by insects or disease, and which can quickly cover a trellis or arbor.

The fragrant flowers resemble clematis and bear heavy clusters of oval lime-sized green fruits that ripen in autumn. The sweetness and juiciness of the fruits is unbelievable - more delicious than the sweetest melon you have ever tasted, and even juicier than the finest quality dessert grape. You'll want to eat most of them fresh off the vine, but fruits can also be used to make pie fillings and jam. They have almost 20 times the vitamin C content of oranges. Unlike the fruits of New Zealand kiwis, which must be peeled, the skin of the Arctic Kiwi is tender and edible, like a cherry or grape. Zones 4-7.



Since the Arctic Kiwi needs cross-pollination to set fruit, we supply 2 female plants (variety Anna) and 1 male (variety Meader). Size at Maturity: 6 to 10 ft. high, 4 ft. wide — Soil Preference: Tolerates poor soils, 5.0 to 6.8 pH.

LINGONBERRIES



Regal Lingonberry - BU-R-2600

Is the newest Lingonberry cultivar, hybridized by the University of Wisconsin. It is known for large fruit, heavy flowering, and early double cropping yields. Dark green, tiny ovate leaves grow on multiple 8 to 15 inch erect stems spreading outward 20 inches. The ever-green foliage is deep green and has a waxy gloss. Regal makes a very attractive ground cover or border plant; you can even walk on the resilient plants without damaging them. Pure white bell shaped flowers with a tinge of pink will flower profusely 2 times ever year, once in the spring and again in mid-summer. Lingonberries are high in Vitamin C and have many of the same health benefits of blueberries and cranberries, their native cousins.

Zones 3-9.

Red Pearl Lingonberry - BU-R-2500 This wild European variety is very vigorous, and high yielding; 1 to 1.5 pounds per plant. Red Pearl grows to 12"-18" high and spreads rapidly. The sweet-acid berries are bright red and the size of a small blueberry. Its oval leaves turn to a burnt red in fall. Zones 3-9.

NATIVE RHODODENDRONS

Native rhododendrons are easy to grow. The species are adaptable to the climates and soils where they grow naturally. There are almost 1,000 species worldwide with so many distinct characteristics. We are growing 3 of the species indigenous to North America.

SWEET AZALEA

This species is sometime multi stemmed or sometimes growing as a small single trunk tree towering 8 to 20 feet in the right location. The fragrant flowers are brightest white and sometimes have a bluish tinge with protruding red stamens. The plants are found near streams and moist forests. Summer foliage is glossy green, changing to orange reddish leaves in the autumn. Zones 5-8

PINKSHELL AZALEA

This rare species is multi stemmed shrub growing to a height of 6-15 feet. The Pinkshell flowers early in the summer with large light pink clusters of blooms. The plants grow successfully in a wide range of soil types and are tolerant to dry soils and drought conditions. The summer leaves are glossy and shiny green on top and bright red in the autumn. Zones 5-8

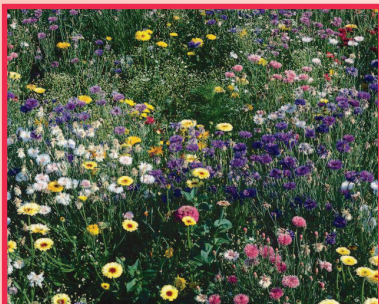

The highly disease resistant plant is a recent introduction from the New York Fruit Testing Station. The vigorous plants are early ripening, and in our experience, they are a big improvement over the popular 'Bristol.'



Black raspberries have been called the "king of berries" because of their superior health benefits. They are very high in antioxidants which are known to prevent heart disease, cancer, stroke, and possibly Alzheimer's disease. The berries also contain more anthocyanins than any other food. Anthocyanins give the berries their dark color in the skin. In addition to having anti-inflammatory properties, anthocyanins have been linked to cardiovascular health, vision improvement, memory retention improvement, and reducing hypertension. Black raspberries are also rich in ellagic acid, a powerful anti-carcinogen compound that is also anti-viral and anti-bacterial. After very promising trials on rats and mice, Ohio State University has begun human clinical trials to test the black raspberries effects on esophageal and colon cancers.

Jewell's berries are large and firm; many of the berries are the size of a nickel or larger. The berries retain their firmness several days after refrigeration, and freeze easily as a whole berry if left unwashed. It is easy to pick Jewell's berries that grow on upright canes. The plants are very manageable for a garden, pruning them 4 to 5 feet tall. A mature plant would yield 8 to 10 pounds for home gardeners.
