

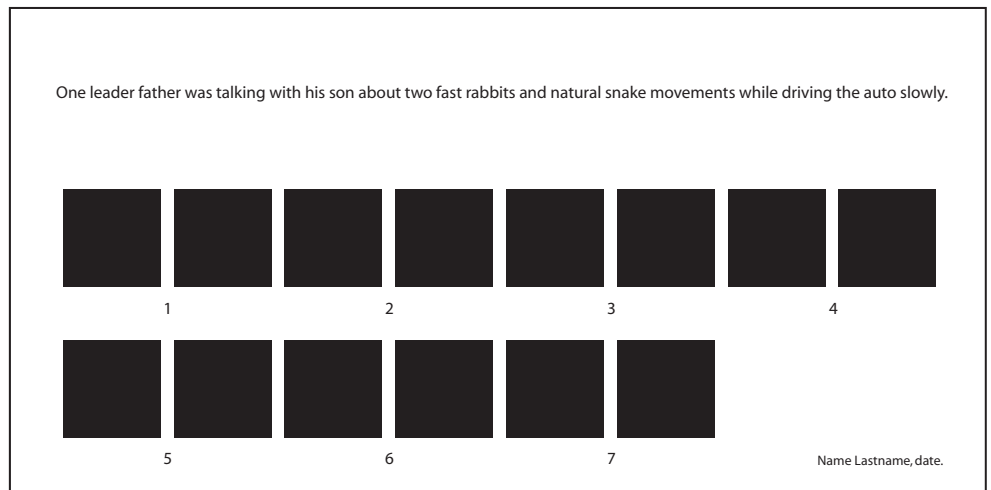


# PROJECT 3.

## A Visual Hierarchy

- AIM** The project is meant to train with the basic typographic controls, the use of controlled anamorphic transformations, reading basic layouts as architectures.
- TOOLS** Sketches; Helvetica font; vector-based software.
- FORMAT** 60x 30 cm, white background, on cardboard.
- BRIEFING** Start with sketches. Using *only* the font Helvetica produce a set of 14 compositions, 6 by 6 cm, for the following words:  
Auto, Natural, Driving, Leader, Father, Son, One, Two;  
Rabbits, Snake, Slowly, Fast, Talking, Movements.
- STEP ONE** Think over the meaning of *expressive typography* and set the fourteen words; then convert the (text) words to path and play/distort/order the letter forms within the 6 cm square layout.
- STEP TWO** After critique, once the 14 compositions are established, extract (use) the new word-marks as bricks to set (see the template .ai) a line of text, for the sentence:  
« One leader father was talking with his son about two fast rabbits and natural snake movements while driving the auto slowly. »
