The Council is responsible for following the development of international humanitarian law. In addition the Council supervises the coordination and development among the total defence authorities, focusing especially on information and educational matters. Finally the Council takes the initiative to promote development, dissemination and application of the provisions of international humanitarian law within the Swedish total defence sector.

The Swedish government promotes dissemination and supports different initatives on dissemination of international

humanitarian law including information on CCW and its annexed Protocols to the general public.
