Management Training Program Fact Sheet

The Management Training Program (MTP) is receiving an enthusiastic response across Nebraska. This is an invitation for you to participate in the next series, starting in the late fall.

The Management Training Program:

- The MTP consists of eight training sessions. Sessions 1 7 are 6 hours in length. Session 8 is 3 hours. The training sessions are planned throughout the school year calendar (September May) usually meeting two times a month, or in some cases all day on Saturday. You must attend all sessions. Follow-up activities are also part of each module.
- The MTP modules consist of topics related to the business side of child care. Some of the topics covered in the MTP are: record keeping, budgets, insurance, taxes, health and safety policies, child development, partnerships with families, marketing, ethics, staffing, leadership, and public relations.
- The MTP is designed for child care centers, preschools, and family child care programs.
- Upon completion, participants will have developed or updated their own policy and procedures manual for the program they represent. The manual is developed piece by piece with the completion of the assignments after each training session.
- The MTP costs \$195
- Participants receive a wealth of information from the materials, trainer, and other members in the program. It is an excellent opportunity to network and learn from each other.
- Participants who have completed the MTP tell us the program has made a difference in their early childhood program.

Transportation Training Information

Safe Kids Nebraska Child Care Transportation Training

New regulations require mandatory child passenger safety training for child care centers that transport children

- New regulations took effect May 20, 2013.
 - New employees have 90 days to complete the transportation training
 - Existing employees have 1 year to complete the transportation training
 - Employees will have to complete the training every 5 years


The transportation training will be titled Safe Kids Nebraska Childcare Transportation Training not Safe Kids Buckle Up.

- Home child cares are not required to take the Safe Kids Nebraska Child Care Transportation Training.
- Only employees who are drivers of the children, not every employee, will need to take the training.
- It will be a 3-4 hour training with a pass/fail hands on component.

Information on getting the training:

- The current list of certified child passenger safety technicians offering the training can be found at http://www.safekidsnebraska.org
- Child care centers needing the training must contact the trainer in their area to set up the training. DHHS and Safe Kids Nebraska are not coordinating these trainings.
- Trainings may be offered by individual child passenger safety technicians or in conjunction with local organizations such as health departments. Training fees are set by those offering the trainings.
- Individuals that successfully complete the training will be provided a certificate of completion for 3 clock hours of continuing education. The certificate is valid for 5 years.
