- 1. They are not located within a Thoroughfare Overlay Zone.
- 2. They are not located within 1,000 feet of a house of worship, school, park, or day care center.

There are existing sweepstakes centers located within unincorporated Volusia County. While not specifically defined as a use within the zoning code, the county has previously classified and approved these businesses as either a game room or retail sales/service. Game rooms and retail sales/service are permitted principal uses in only the B3, B4, and B5 zoning classifications. The addition of sweepstakes centers as a new use in these zoning classifications could be compatible. The limitations on sweepstakes centers' proximity to houses of worship and children's areas will make a few of the existing centers nonconforming. Those existing operations will then be regulated by the nonconforming use provisions of the zoning code.

Discussion on zoning regulation of sweepstake and game promotions in Volusia County

Growth and Resource Management Department Director Greg Stubbs gave the staff report and displayed overhead area maps showing the location of the four existing sweepstake/game promotion/retail sales and service establishments in the unincorporated County area. They were permitted uses in the B-3, B-4 and B-5 zoning classifications. Mr. Stubbs also displayed a spreadsheet comparing the cities' regulations on such uses with the County's. He noted the City of DeBary was the most restrictive, allowing such uses only in its Light Industrial classification. The definitions and regulations were different among all the cities and the County.

Council Member Northey said she had requested the report simply to ensure that the County had zoning regulations similar to those of the cities. She did not want rejections by the cities to end up in the County. She preferred seeing such uses in an Industrial zoning classification, but apparently only DeBary had opted for that. She also liked what Ormond Beach had done in requiring a 1,000-foot distance separation from any school, house of worship or youth activity building.

John Stockham, Planner III, displayed slides of the Future Land Use Map and pointed out areas where Industrial uses were permitted. Some Council discussion followed. Chair Bruno thought city gateways should be addressed and said the question was if the Council should proceed on a particular zoning regulation for such an operation. Council Member Hayman felt the cities should lead the way for the County, but felt in the County such uses should ideally be in a business or commercial classifications. Council Member Kelly also liked the approach Ormond Beach had used as well as the gateway placement idea, as decided by the city in question. The city's wishes had to be respected.

Council Member Northey moved to DIRECT staff to return with an ordinance for sweepstake/game promotion/retail sales and service establishments providing for a 1,000-foot distance separation from any school, house of worship or youth activity building and that the ordinance also EXCLUDE such a use in approved gateways existing between the County and the cities. Council Member Kelly seconded the motion, which CARRIED 6-0, with Council Member Alexander absent due to a death in the family.
