Make informed decisions

UnitedHealthcare Prescription Drug List (PDL)

The PDL includes brand and generic prescription medications approved by the FDA. Medications are placed on different "tiers" based on our conclusion about their overall value. Tier 1 is the lowest-cost tier option. When selecting a medication, you and your doctor should consult the PDL.

Save money

Look for potential lower-cost alternatives

Log on to My Account at uhcsr.com to look for your lowest-cost options. Ask your doctor if a lower-cost alternative medication may be right for you.

Generic options

Many brand medications have generic equivalents available. Generics contain the same active ingredients (the chemicals that make a medication work) as brand medications. Generic medications must meet the same FDA brand medication standards.
