



Steps to Success!

1. Review the *Election Timeline* sheet.
2. Complete *ASNIC Position Eligibility Form* to make sure you are eligible.
3. Complete the *Petition for Signatures* by asking fellow students to sponsor you.
4. *Fill out the questionnaire provided.* This information will be transferred to the *Election Platform* sheet. **If you would like an electronic format of the questionnaire please email Nick Dimico at nmdimico@nic.edu, subject: Election Packet. *Emails should have the questionnaire filled out to your liking along with a picture.**
5. Please provide a photograph for the picture space. If you need your picture taken, contact Heather Erikson or Dean Bennett in the ASNIC office, and they can use a digital camera. **Please email your picture to Nick Dimico at nmdimico@nic.edu along with your questionnaire.**
6. Provide your name and contact information in the Election Packet and turn it in **no later than September 6th, 2011** in the ASNIC office, 2nd floor of SUB.
7. Make sure your schedule allows that you can attend the ASNIC work sessions held **every Tuesday at 9:00 AM to 11:00 AM** and the ASNIC Board Meetings held **every second and fourth Tuesday at noon.**
8. Meet with the ASNIC Advisors, current Board Members, Administration, and NIC student leadership to help educate you about NIC and the issues here on campus!

- September 12th- September 16th -Campaigning/General Elections
- September 16th @ 2:30 p.m. – Polls Close/New officer's announced/All posters need to be taken down by 5 p.m.
- September 20th – All officers weekly meet at 9 a.m.
