\section*{First stage}

Three samples of constituencies were drawn, one in England, one in Scotland (south of the Caledonian Canal) and one in Wiles The same general techniques were used In each area all constituencies were hated alphabetically within Registrar General's St ind ind region and the total electorate for each area was accumulated A sampling interval was calculated by dividing the total accurvilated electorate by the number of sampling points required in each area ( 20 in Scotland, 15 in \(W_{\text {ales a and }} 65\) in england) A random number was selected between 1 and the sampling interval, and this number indicated the first consutuency selected Subsequent constituencies were selected by adding the sampling interval to the random number until the right number of constituencies had been selected This provided a sample of consithenctes, drawn with probability proportionate to the size of the electorate in that constituency
