1 The sample

First stage

Three samples of constituencies were drawn, one in England, one in Scotland (south of the Caledonian Canil) and one in Wiles. The same general techniques were used. In each area all constituencies were listed alphabetically within Registrar General's Standard region and the total electorate for each area was accumulated. A sampling interval was calculated by dividing the total accumulated electorate by the number of sampling points required in each area (20 in Scotland, 15 in Wales and 65 in England). A random number was selected between 1 and the sampling interval, and this number indicated the first constituencies lected. Subsequent constituencies were selected by adding the sampling interval to the random number until the right number of constituencies had been selected. This provided a sample of constituencies, drawn with probability proportionate to the size of the electorate in that constituency.

Second stage

In each of the selected urban constituencies one ward was selected and in each of the selected rural constituencies one parish was selected with probability proportionate to the size of the electorate in the ward. Within each of the selected wards only two polling districts were selected, again with probability proportionate to size of the electorate in the polling district.

In total 164 sampling units were chosen, 31 in Scotland, 22 in Wales and 111 in England

Third stage

Ten names were drawn from the current electoral registers in each of the selected polling districts. Twenty names were drawn from the current electoral registers in each of the selected parishes. Since the same number of electors was drawn in each constituency (i.e. 20 per constituency, either 10 in each of two polling districts within a ward or 20 in one parish), the initial bias due to the selection with probability proportionate to size was redressed, and a sample was produced in which each elector in Scotland, in Wales and in England had an equal chance of selection. In total 2000 names were drawn

2 The questionnaire

Standard States

Five group discussions were conducted in various parts of Great Britain They were conducted to help in the design of the draft questionnaire, which was then piloted and amended accordingly
